**W**HEREAS it is expedient to amend the law relative to Larceny by Preamble.  
Carriers and other Bailees Be it enacted by the Queen's Most  
Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative  
Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament  
5 assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. If any person being a Bailee of goods or chattels shall with intent to defraud convert such goods or chattels to his own use or the use of any person other than the owner thereof although he shall not break bulk or otherwise determine the bailment he shall be guilty of larceny.

**LAW OF LARCENY AMENDMENT BILL.**

**As proposed by the Solicitor General  
in substitution for Bill issued on 6th  
July, 1858.**

**WHEREAS** it is expedient to amend the law relating to Letters of  
 Carriers and other Estates, as it enacted by the Queen's Most  
 Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords  
 Spiritual and Temporal, Great Officers of State, Privy Council, and  
 Commons, in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

I. If any person being a bailee of goods or chattels shall with  
 intent to defraud convert such goods or chattels or any part thereof to his  
 own use in the name of any person other than the owner thereof, although  
 he shall not determine the nature of the goods or chattels of which

any person shall be liable to answer for the same as if he were  
 the owner thereof.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the law relative to larceny by  
carriers and other persons, and to provide for the punishment of such  
offences, His Majesty's most Excellent Majesty in Council has  
thought fit to enact the following provisions in relation to  
larceny by carriers and other persons, and to give effect to the  
intent of the said Statute in relation to the same:—

1. If any person being a carrier of goods or chattels shall with  
intent to defraud convert any goods or chattels or any part thereof to his  
own use or the use of any other person, he shall be guilty of larceny:  
Provided that no person shall be deemed to have converted any goods or  
chattels so entrusted to his care, custody, or possession, who shall not  
intend to deprive the owner of the same for ever.

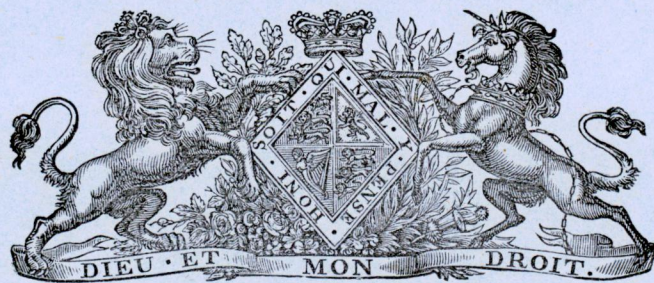

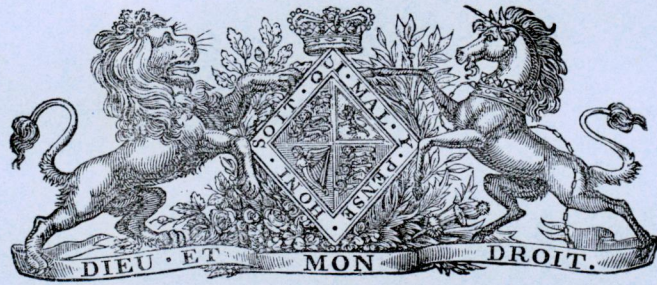

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to amend the law relative to Larceny by Carriers and other Bailees Be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. If any person being a Bailee of goods or chattels shall with intent to defraud convert such goods or chattels or any part thereof to his own use or the use of any person other than the owner thereof he shall be guilty of larceny.

Bailees fraudulently converting goods to their own use guilty of larceny.

2. The Act fourteenth Victoria number six intituled "*An Act to prevent frauds by Carriers and Drivers*" is hereby repealed except so far as relates to any offence against the provisions of that Act committed before the passing of the present Act.
