An Act to abolish the Duty on Gold.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the ^{Preamble.} advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

5 1. The Act twentieth Victoria number seventeen for granting a ^{Repeal of 20 Vict. Nos. 17 and 22.} Duty upon Gold and the Act twentieth Victoria number twenty-two shall be repealed on and from the date of the passing of this Act.

2. The Governor may with the advice of the Executive Council ^{Governor to make rules.} make Regulations for the receipt custody and transmission of 10 Gold at and from any place in the Colony.

3. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Gold Duty ^{Short Title.} Abolition Act of 1860."
