

WHEREAS it is expedient to enable the Government to borrow the Preamble. sum of three hundred and sixty-five thousand six hundred pounds to pay off certain Debentures which will fall due in the year 1860 Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:
