An Act to enable the Government to raise a certain Loan to meet Debentures falling due in 1860.

WHEREAS it is expedient to enable the Government to borrow the sum of three hundred and sixty-five thousand six hundred pounds to pay off certain Debentures which will fall due in the year 1860 Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council to raise by the sale of Debentures secured upon the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony and bearing interest at a rate not exceeding five per centum per annum such sum or sums of money not exceeding three hundred and sixty-five thousand six hundred pounds in the whole as may be required to pay off and discharge certain Debentures which will fall due in 1860 hereinafter more particularly specified that is to say—

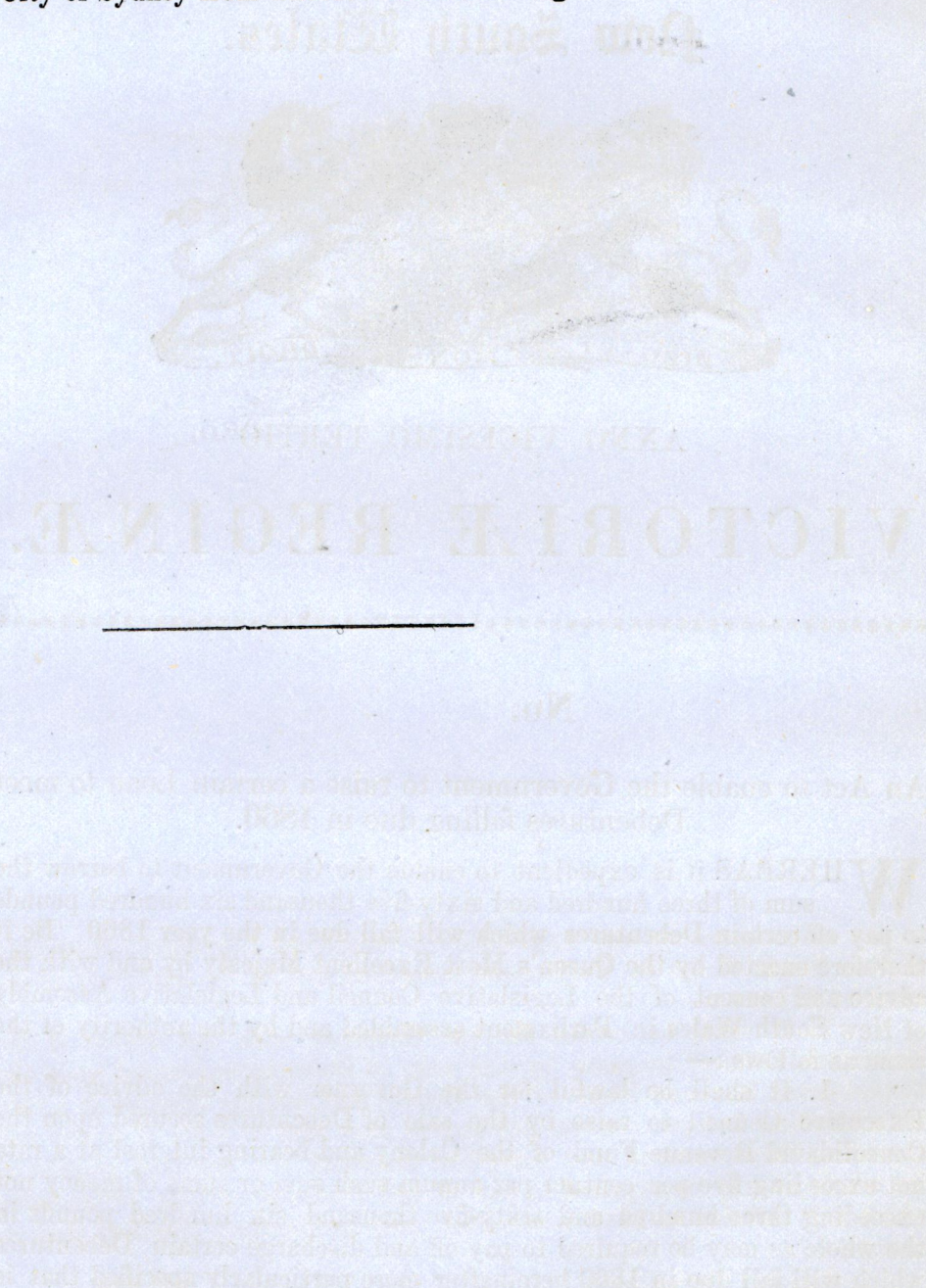

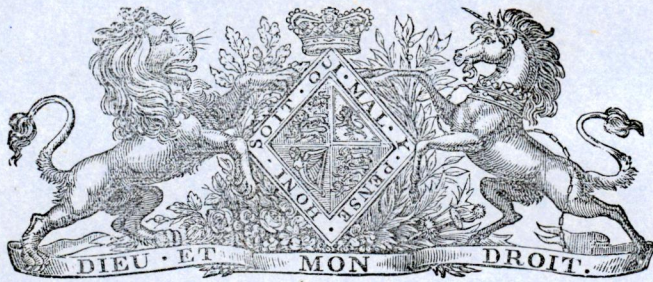
