An Act to alter and amend the Law relating to the Salaries of certain Public Officers.

HEREAS it is expedient to alter and amend the Law relating to Preamble. the Salaries of certain Public Officers Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New

5 South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. The Act twentieth Victoria number eighteen and so much of 20 Vic. No. 18 and Schedule A to the Constitution Act of 1855 as provides for the Salary A to Constitution of any future Governor General and for the Salaries of the Colonial Act of 1855 repealed. 10 Secretary—the Colonial Treasurer—the Attorney General—and the

Solicitor General are hereby repealed.

2. There shall be charged upon and paid out of the Consolidated Governor's Salary Revenue Fund in each and every year to the Governor of the Colony fixed at £5,000. for the time being the sum of £5,000 Provided that nothing herein Proviso. 15 contained shall affect the Salary of the present Governor General until

after the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.

3. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Official short Title, "Salaries alteration Act of 1860."
