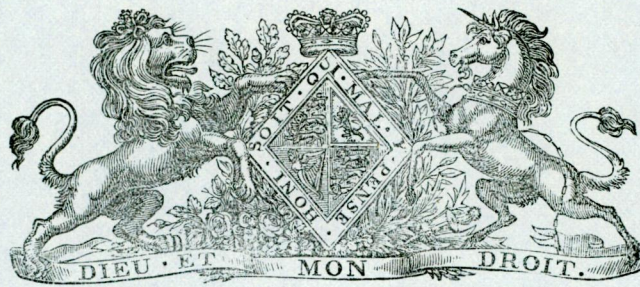

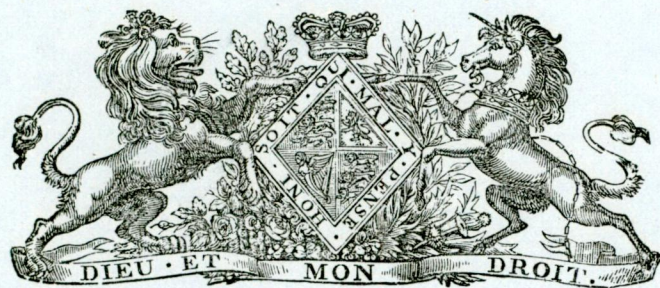

An Act to repeal amend so much of the "Tolls Amendment Act 1857" as relates to Broad Wheels.

(As amended and agreed to in Select Committee.)

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal amend so much of the "Tolls Amendment Act 1857" as relates to the breadth of wheels Be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. So much and such parts of the Tolls Amendment Act 1857 as relate to the breadth of wheels and especially the third fourth fifth sixth seventh and eighth sections of the said Act shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

Enactments for Broad Wheels repealed.

1. The third and fourth sections of the said recited Act are hereby repealed.

Sect. 3 of 20 Vic. No. 38 repealed.

2. From the time when this Act shall take effect every cart dray wain waggon or other such carriage all the wheels whereof shall not be less than five inches wide in the tire shall be charged with half the toll only to which they would otherwise be liable.

Broad wheels charged half toll only.

3. It shall thenceforward be lawful for any Trustee or Commissioner of any turnpike road or their Lessee or for any Collector of Tolls or for any person acting under the authority of any such Trustee Commissioner Lessee or Collector to measure the breadth of the wheels of any waggon cart or other carriage in respect whereof a reduction of toll is claimed under this Act before the same shall be allowed to pass through any toll-gate or bar at which toll shall be payable.

Power to measure wheels.

4. The remaining provisions of the said recited Act shall in all cases occurring under this Act be applied so far as the same are applicable.

Applying other provisions of Act.

5. This Act shall take effect on the 1st day of January 1861 and shall be styled and may be cited as the "Broad Wheel Repeal Amendment Act."

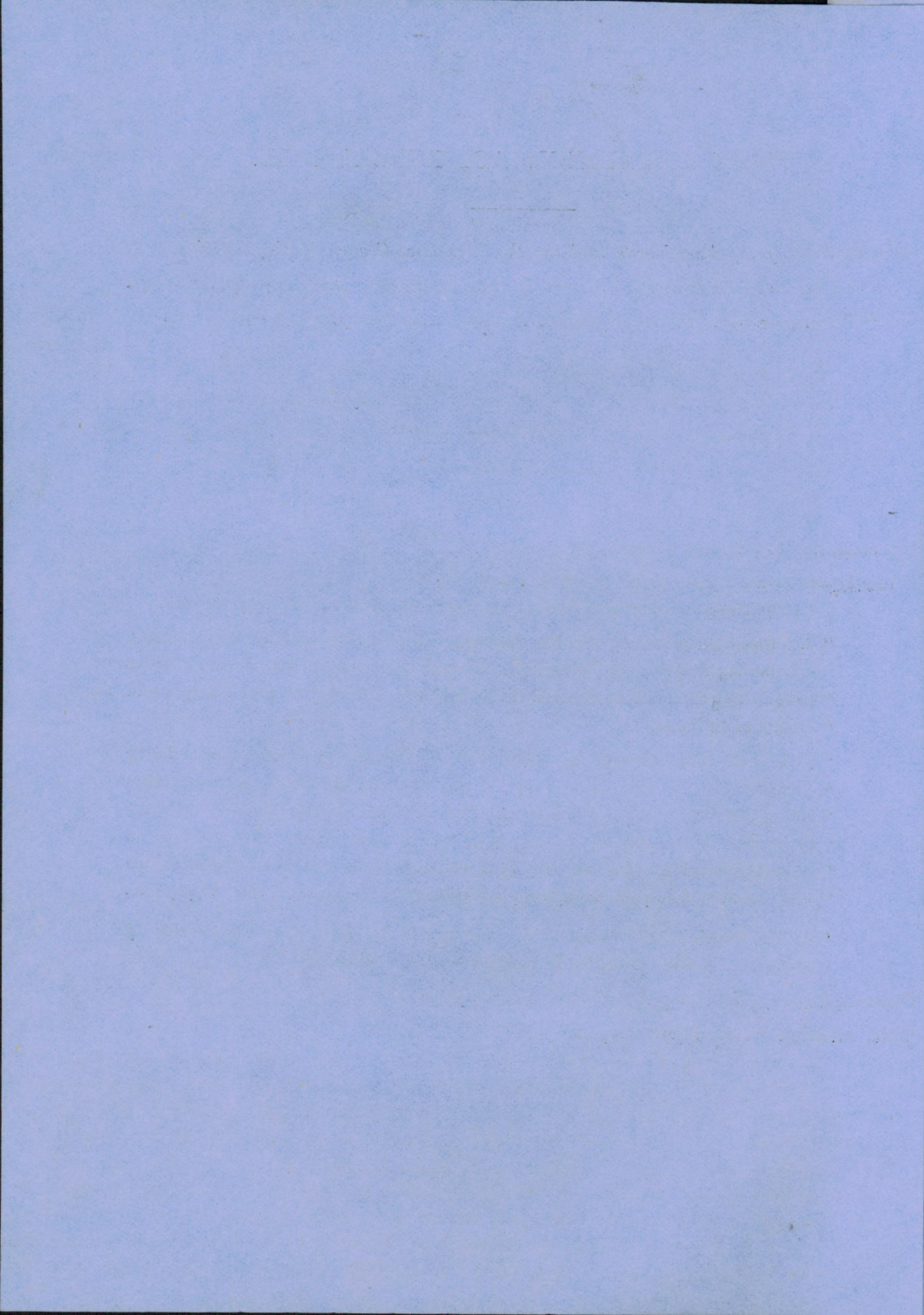
Preamble, line 1, *substitute* “ amend” for “ repeal.”

Clause 1, *omit* clause 1 ; *insert* the following clauses :—

- “ 1. The third and fourth sections of the said recited Act are hereby repealed.
- “ 2. From the time when this Act shall take effect every cart dray wain waggon
“ or other such carriage all the wheels whereof shall not be less than five inches
“ wide in the tire shall be charged with half the toll only to which they would
“ otherwise be liable.
- “ 3. It shall thenceforward be lawful for any Trustee or Commissioner of any
“ turnpike road or their Lessee or for any Collector of Tolls or for any person
“ acting under the authority of any such Trustee Commissioner Lessee or Collector
