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# A BILL

To repeal certain Imperial Enactments as to modes of proof in certain cases.

[Presented by THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, 16 May, 1860.]

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**W**HEREAS by the Imperial Act twenty-second and twenty-third Preamble.  
Victoria chapter twelve power is given to the Colonial Legis-  
lature to repeal alter or amend certain provisions relating to the modes of  
Proof by Affidavit or Declaration in certain cases contained in the  
5 Imperial Acts fifty-fourth George the Third chapter fifteen and fifth and  
sixth William the Fourth chapter sixty-two so far as they apply to this  
Colony And whereas it is expedient to repeal the said provisions Be it  
therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with  
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative  
10 Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the  
authority of the same as follows:—

2. Nothing herein contained shall prejudice or affect the validity Not to affect pro-  
ceedings already

of any Affidavit or Declaration lawfully made before the passing of this  
20 Act or any proceeding lawfully taken or any act lawfully done under  
or by virtue or in consequence of any such Affidavit or Declaration.

3. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Proof by Short Title.  
"Declaration Amendment Act of 1860."



# ARTICLE I

SECTION 1. The Legislature shall consist of a Senate and an Assembly.

SECTION 2. The Senate shall be composed of members elected by the electors of the State.

SECTION 3. The Assembly shall be composed of members elected by the electors of the State.

SECTION 4. The first section of this article shall not apply to the first election of the Senate and the first election of the Assembly.

SECTION 5. Nothing contained in this article shall prevent the Legislature from exercising its powers.

SECTION 6. This article shall not apply to the first election of the Senate and the first election of the Assembly.
