For continuance of Temporary Acts.

[Presented by THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, 16 May, 1860.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for accidental delay in the Preamble.
passing of Bills to continue Acts about to expire Be it enacted by
the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent
of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales

A BILL

The Continuation of Temporary Act

Enacted by the Attorney General in 1900

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for additional delay in the
operation of this Act in certain cases about to expire, and it is
the duty of His Majesty's Government to do so with the object and intent
of the Legislature, and His Majesty's Government have accordingly
in Parliament enacted and by the authority of the same as follows—

1. Where any Bill for continuing any temporary Act shall have
been passed by the Legislature and be still pending at the date of such
Act expiring, the Bill shall nevertheless be deemed to have passed
and shall be deemed to have taken effect in continuing
the temporary Act on and from the day of its expiration, provided that
the Act shall be subject to any amendment or variation for or
in respect of any thing done or omitted by the contrary of any provision
of the continued Act between the day of its expiration and the date of
such amendment.

2. The Act shall be deemed to have been passed on the day of its
expiration.
