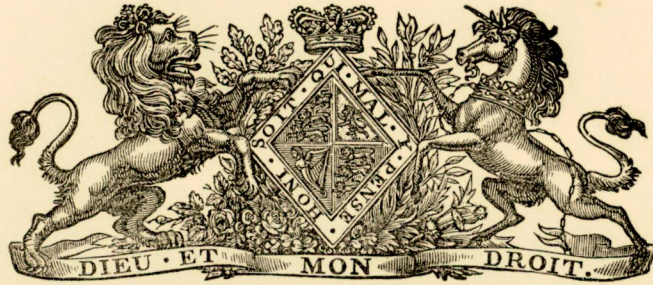

### An Act to alter the Duties on Colonial Spirits.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to alter the Duties upon Spirits distilled Preamble.  
within the Colony Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's  
Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the  
Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in  
Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. The Act nineteenth Victoria number fifteen is hereby Repeal of 19 Vic. No. 15. repealed.
2. In lieu of the duties now payable upon Spirits distilled Duties to be levied.  
within the Colony there shall be paid the duties mentioned in the  
Schedule hereto.
3. Provided that nothing herein shall render liable to the pay- Proviso as to wine-growers' brandy under 13 Vic. No. 27.  
ment of any such duty any brandy distilled by any maker of wine for  
fortifying wines the produce of his own vineyard within the Colony  
to the degree of strength authorized by the Act thirteenth Victoria  
number twenty-seven.
4. The word "proof" as used in the Schedule to this Act shall "Proof."  
be held to mean the strength of proof by Sykes' Hydrometer.
5. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the Short title.  
"Colonial Spirits Duties Act of 1864."

### SCHEDULE.

- On Rum distilled within the Colony when made or distilled from Sugar which shall have paid Customs Duties—the proof gallon—Seven shillings and five-pence
- On Rum distilled within the Colony when made or distilled wholly or in any proportion exceeding ten per cent. of the whole from materials which are not subject to any duty of Customs—the proof gallon—Eight shillings
- On all other Spirits distilled within the Colony—the proof gallon—Ten shillings

An Act to amend the Duties on Colonial Spirits.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Duties upon Spirits distilled within the Colony: And it is therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Act intimatedly Victoria number fifteen is hereby amended as follows:—

2. In lieu of the duties now payable upon spirits distilled within the Colony there shall be paid the duties mentioned in the Schedule annexed to this Act.

3. Provided that nothing herein shall render liable to the payment of any such duty any brandy distilled by any master or wife for his or her private use, or any quantity of spirits distilled by any person for his or her private use, or the amount of strength authorized by the Act intimatedly Victoria number twenty-seven.

4. The word "proof" as used in the Schedule to this Act shall be held to mean the strength of proof by spirit Hydrometer.

5. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Colonial Spirits Duties Act of 1901."
