An Act to alter the Duties on Colonial Spirits.

HEREAS it is expedient to alter the Duties upon Spirits distilled Preamble. within the Colony Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in 5 Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Act nineteenth Victoria number fifteen is hereby Repeal of 19 Vic.

2. In lieu of the duties now payable upon Spirits distilled Duties to be levied. within the Colony there shall be paid the duties mentioned in the 10 Schedule hereto.

3. Provided that nothing herein shall render liable to the pay- Proviso as to winement of any such duty any brandy distilled by any maker of wine for growers' brandy distilled by any maker of wine for under 13 Vic. 
