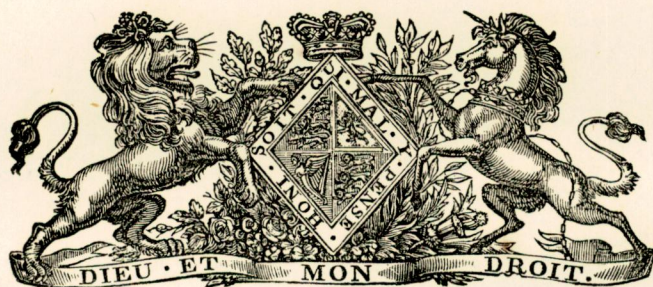

An Act to amend the Law of False Pretences.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law relating to False Pretences Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

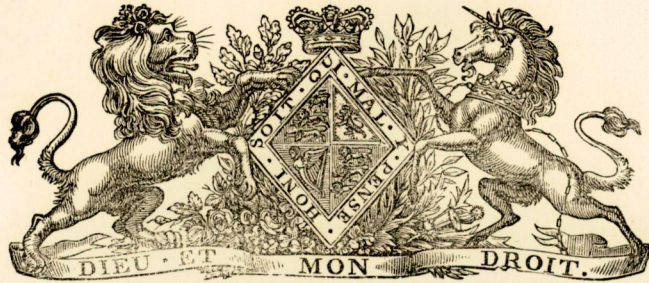
5 1. If any person shall by any false pretence obtain the signature of any other person to any bill of exchange promissory note or any valuable security with intent to cheat or defraud every such offender shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and being convicted thereof shall be liable at the discretion of the Court to be sentenced to hard labor on the roads or other public works of the Colony for the term of four years or to suffer such other punishment by fine or imprisonment or by both as the Court shall award.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law relating to False Preamble.  
Pretences Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent  
Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled  
and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. If any person shall by any false pretence obtain the signature  
of any other person to any bill of exchange promissory note or any valuable  
security with intent to cheat or defraud every such offender shall be guilty  
of a misdemeanor and being convicted thereof shall be liable at the discre-  
tion of the Court to be sentenced to hard labor on the roads or other public

An Act to amend the Law of False Testimony. [Assented to, 20th January, 1861.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law relating to False Testimony, His Majesty the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. If any person shall by any false testimony obtain the signature of any other person to any bill of exchange, promissory note, or any valuable security with intent to cheat or defraud every such offender shall be guilty of a misdemeanour and being convicted thereof shall be liable at the discretion of the Court to be sentenced to hard labour on the roads or other public works of the Colony for the term of four years or to suffer such other punishment by fine or imprisonment or by both as the Court shall award.
