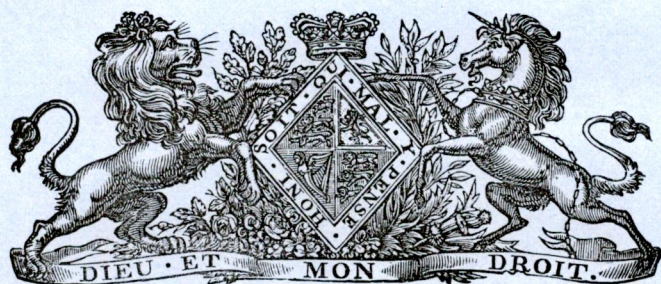

An Act to limit the power of Justices of the Peace in certain cases.

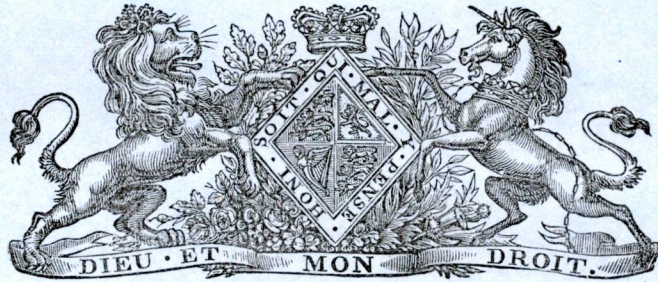
BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

5 1. In every case where under the Act of Council fifteenth Victoria number four any Justice of the Peace alone or jointly with any other Justice of the Peace may by summary conviction or order commit any person to imprisonment for any longer term than six months such Justice of the Peace alone or jointly as aforesaid shall not hereafter so
10 commit any such person for any term of imprisonment exceeding six months.

Magistrates summary imprisonments limited to six months.

2. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Magistrates' Powers Limitation Act." Short title.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. In every case where under the Act of Council fifteenth Victoria number four any Justice of the Peace alone or jointly with any other Justice of the Peace may by summary conviction or order commit any person to imprisonment for any longer term than six months such Justice of the Peace alone or jointly as aforesaid shall not hereafter so commit any such person for any term of imprisonment exceeding six months.
