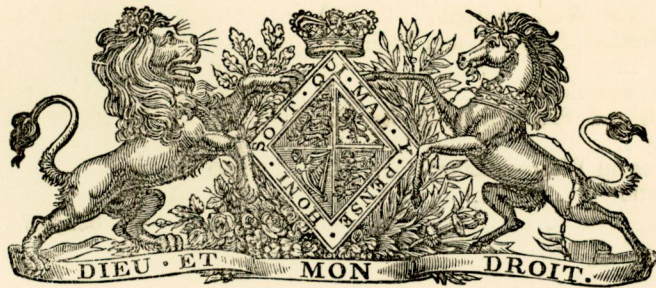

An Act to enable the Government to raise a Loan for certain Public Works.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to authorize the Government to borrow Preamble. certain sums of money amounting in the whole to Six hundred and seventy thousand and twenty-five pounds twelve shillings and seven pence for the several purposes hereinafter specified Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council to raise by the sale of Debentures secured upon the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony and bearing interest at a rate not exceeding five per centum per annum such several sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of Six hundred and seventy thousand and twenty-five pounds twelve shillings and seven pence as may be required for the following several purposes not exceeding for the same respectively the several sums respectively set against such purposes :— Loan of £670,025 12s. 7d.

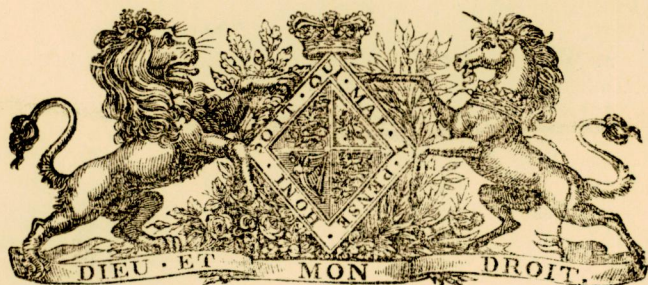

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to authorize the Government to borrow Preamble. certain sums of money amounting in the whole to Six hundred and seventy thousand and twenty-five pounds twelve shillings and seven pence for the several purposes hereinafter specified Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. 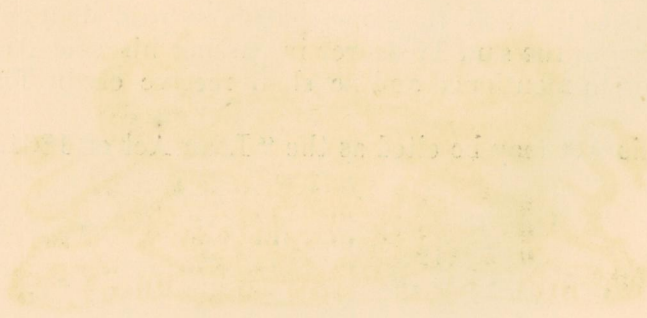

AN ACT TO REGULATE THE COURTS OF THIS STATE

SECTION 1. The judges of the Supreme Court shall be chosen by the Legislature for the term of seven years, and shall hold their offices until the expiration of the same.

SECTION 2. The judges of the Supreme Court shall sit in the city of Charleston, and shall hold their courts on the first day of January, and on the first day of July, in every year.
