This PUBLIC BILL originated in the LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, and, having this day passed, is now ready for presentation to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.

An Act to amend the Laws relating to Seamen.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Laws relating to the Preamble. engagement and discharge of Seamen and to repeal certain enactments concerning seamen's lodging houses Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the 5 advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority

of the same as follows :-

1. So much of the Act seventeenth Victoria number thirty-six Repeal of certain as relates to seamen's lodging houses comprising sections thirty-one enactments.

- 10 to thirty-nine both inclusive and the Act nineteenth Victoria number eight relating to the like matter at Newcastle and other ports and the forty-fourth section of the Act fourth William the Fourth number seven relating to the apprehension of Seamen without a pass are hereby repealed.
- 15 2. The terms in inverted commas in the forty-sixth section of Interpretation. the Act seventeenth Victoria number thirty-six when used in this Act shall bear the same interpretations respectively as are therein assigned to them.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the said Act seven-Masters relieved 20 teenth Victoria number thirty-six the attendance of any master or owner ^{from attendance at} Shipping Office on at the Shipping Office upon the engagement of a seaman shall be ^{engaging seamen.} dispensed with Provided that such master or owner transmit by the seaman so to be engaged by him an application in writing under the 638— hand

hand of such master or owner addressed to the Shipping Master

stating the name of such seaman and the particulars of such engagement Provided also that if any seamen regularly shipped in any vessel engaged solely in the coasting trade shall on the day of the 5 proposed sailing of such vessel and after the Shipping Office is closed neglect to join or absent themselves without leave it shall be lawful for the master or owner of the said vessel on his own sole authority to engage in writing for one voyage only seamen having regular discharges in the room of such seamen neglecting to join or absenting 10 themselves without leave Provided also that the master shall within twenty-four hours after the then next return of the vessel to the port at which such last mentioned seamen were shipped produce the said seamen with their discharges to the Shipping Master for the purpose of such seamen being regularly shipped or discharged or shall account for 15 not doing so to the satisfaction of the Shipping Master And every master who shall refuse or neglect to comply with this latter proviso shall for such offence on summary complaint by the Shipping Master be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds. 4. Instead of the sum of two shillings fixed by Schedule B Fee for discharge of 20 annexed to the said last mentioned Act there shall be payable at the seamen reduced Shipping Office as the fee for the discharge of seamen separately the sum of one shilling only. 5. Any seaman discharged without his consent and without Compensation for fault on his part justifying such discharge at any time whatever before discharge before 25 the lawful termination of his agreement shall be entitled to receive ment. from the master or owner in addition to any wages due to him compensation for such discharge not exceeding three months wages and may recover such compensation in like manner as if it were wages duly earned Provided that no articles of agreement shall be valid 30 that would render inoperative the provisions of this Act.
6. If at the expiration of his term of service any seaman should Fresh engagement in same vessel without

be desirous with the consent of the master or owner to engage for further charge. further service in any ship or vessel belonging to such owner such further engagement may be made by causing such seaman to sign a

35 new set of articles in the same manner as the primary engagement without any further charge to such seaman.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Act twenty-third Period to elapse Victoria number eleven no seamen having served in a ship or vessel ments of same which shall have entered into any port or harbour of the Colony on seaman. 40 completion of a voyage shall be compellable under any agreement or

engagement to go on board any other ship or vessel until after the expiration of twenty-four hours from the completion of such voyage. 8. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Seamen's Short title.
