The first second and third sections of the Imperial Act fifty-54 Geo. 3 c. 15 ss. fourth George the Third chapter fifteen and the fifteenth and seventeenth 123 and 5 and 6 W. sections of the Imperial Act fifth and sixth William the Fourth chapter repealed as to New sixty-two so far as they apply to this Colony and also the first section of South Wales.


