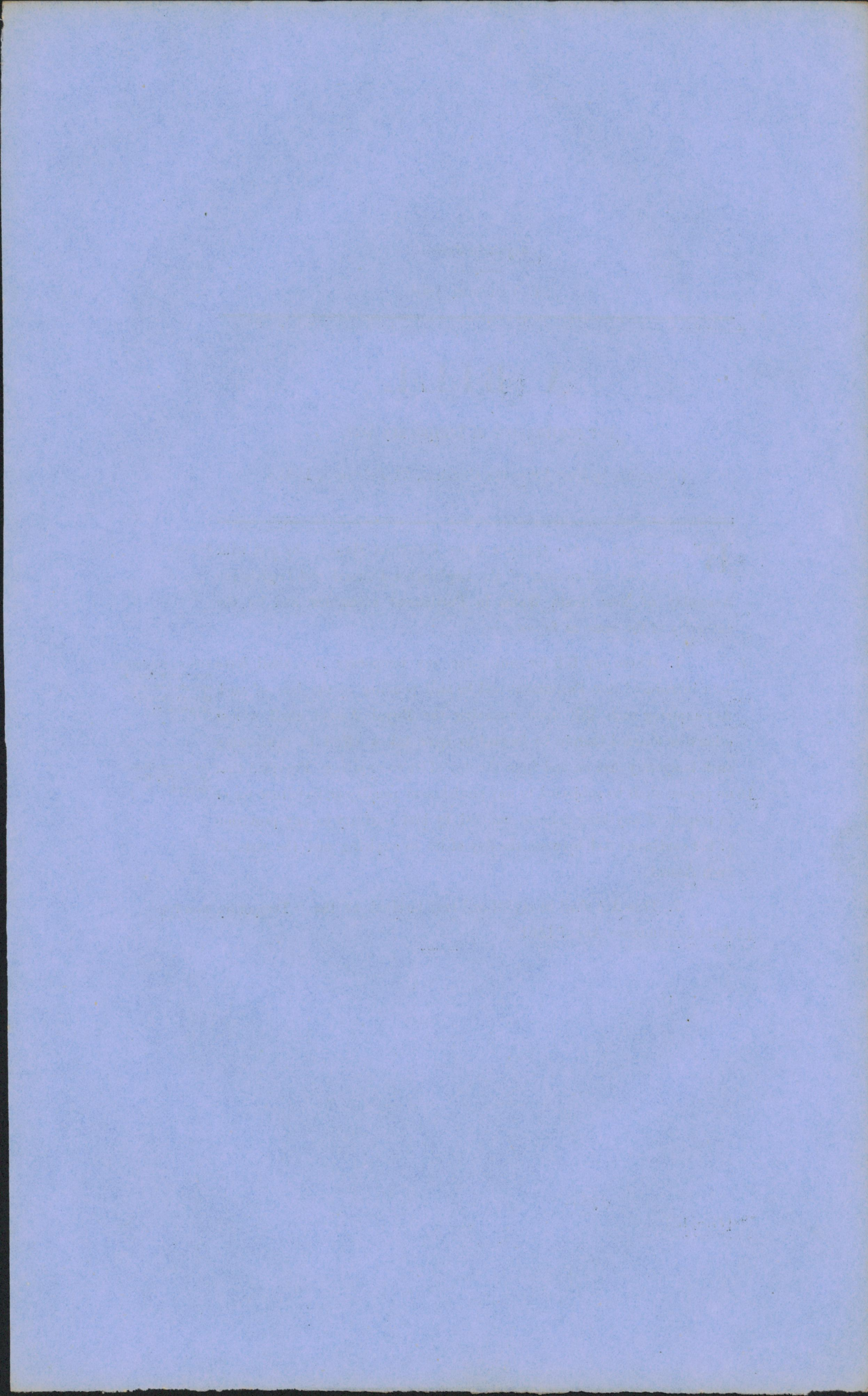

**B**E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with Preamble.  
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative  
Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the  
authority of the same as follows :—

5       1. Where any Bill for continuing any temporary Act shall have  
been introduced into Parliament and be still pending at the date of such Bills for continuing  
temporary Acts to  
operate from expiry  
though passing  
afterwards ;  
Act expiring such Bill upon receiving the Royal Assent shall unless  
otherwise enacted therein be deemed to have taken effect in continuing  
such temporary Act on and from the day of its so expiring Provided that  
10 no person shall be subjected to any punishment penalty or forfeiture for or  
in respect of anything done or omitted by him contrary to any provision  
of the continued Act between the day of its so expiring and the date of  
such Assent. but no penalties  
incurred in the  
interval.

2. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Temporary Short Title.  
15 Acts Continuance Act of 1861."

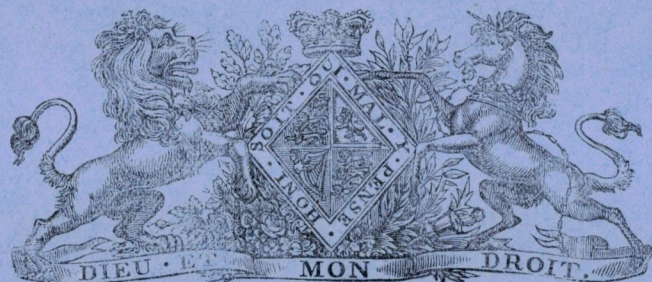

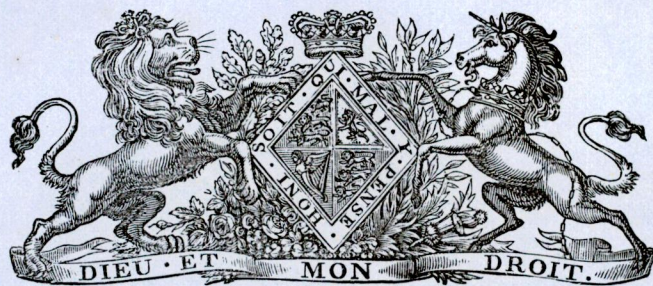

An Act for continuance of Temporary Acts. [Assented to, 3rd May, 1861.]

**B**E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with Preamble. the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. Where any Bill for continuing any temporary Act shall have been introduced into Parliament and be still pending at the date of such Act expiring such Bill upon receiving the Royal Assent shall unless otherwise enacted therein be deemed to have taken effect in continuing such temporary Act on and from the day of its so expiring Bills for continuing temporary Acts to operate from expiry though passing afterwards; Provided that no person shall be subjected to any punishment penalty or forfeiture for or in respect of anything done or omitted by him contrary to any provision of the continued Act between the day of its so expiring and the date of such Assent. but no penalties incurred in the interval.

2. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Temporary Short Title. Acts Continuance Act of 1861."
