WHEREAS it is expedient that further Burials in the Burial Ground known as the Camperdown Cemetery should be discontinued and that Burials in the Burial Ground known as the Randwick Cemetery should be regulated Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. On and after the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight all Burials in the Burial Ground known as the Camperdown Cemetery shall be discontinued and on and after the same date all Burials in the Burial Ground known as the Randwick Cemetery shall be discontinued except the bodies be encased in a leaden coffin and be interred in a vault of stone or brick Interments to be discontinued after a particular day. Provided always that in any case where there is on such day an exclusive right of interment in any vault or enclosure in the Camperdown Cemetery purchased or acquired it shall be lawful for the Colonial Secretary on application being made to him and on his being satisfied that the exercise of such right will not be injurious to health to grant a license for the exercise of such right during such time and subject to such conditions and restrictions as he may think fit And provided also that it shall be lawful to inter bodies encased in leaden coffins in any enclosure in the Randwick Cemetery within which any body shall on such day have been interred and in which on such day an exclusive right of interment shall have been acquired. Proviso.

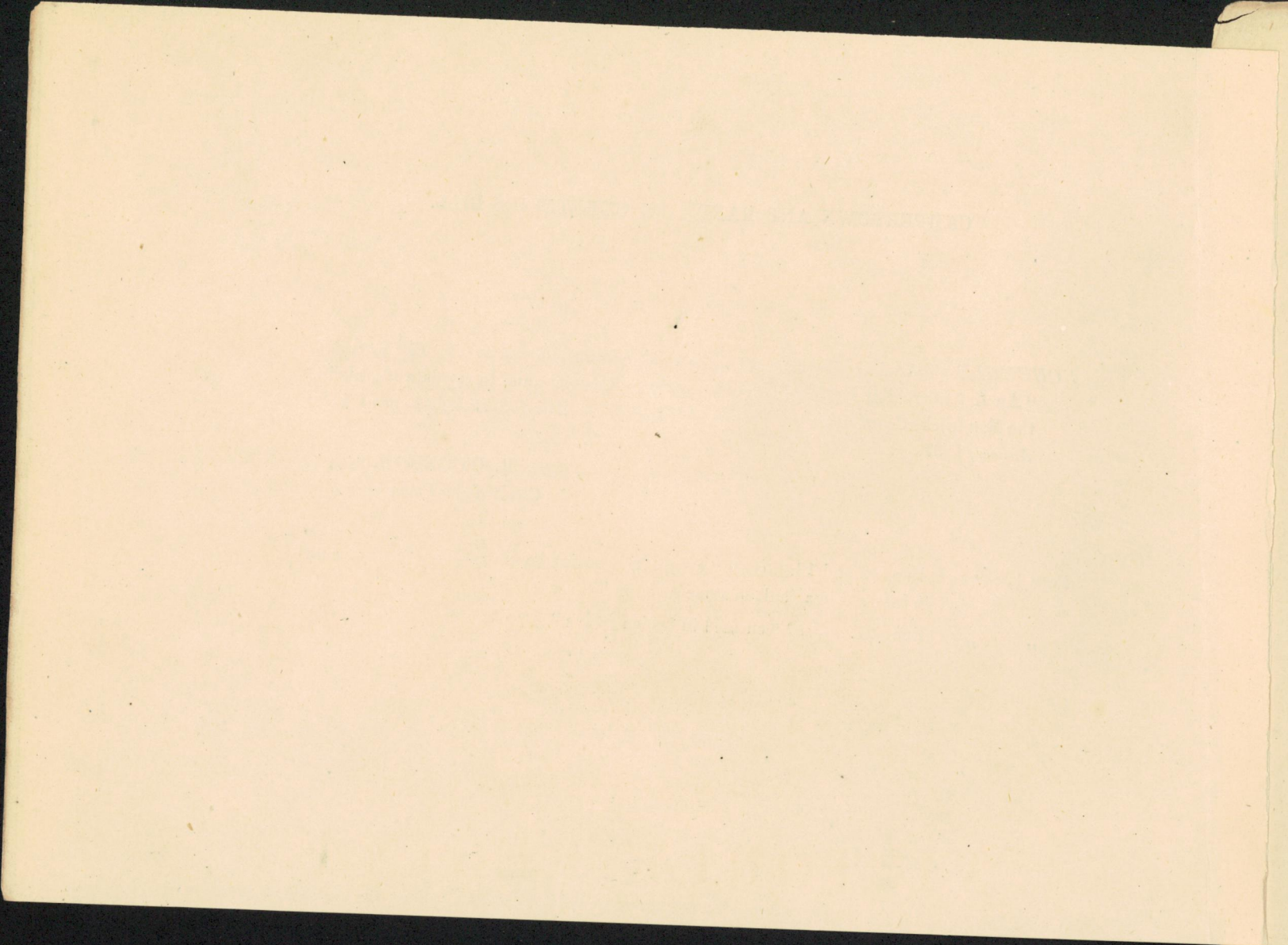

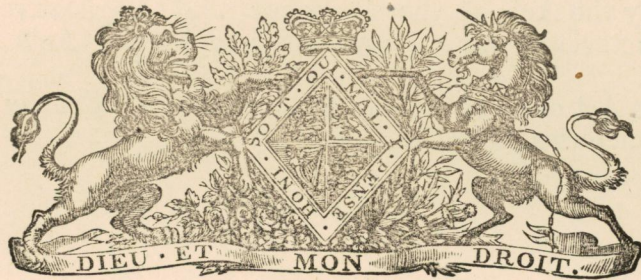
