B^E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :---

5 1. The Acts twentieth Victoria number fifteen and twenty-Repeal of Acts 20 Vict. No. 15 and 24 fourth Victoria number twenty-seven except as to proceedings already Vict. No. 27. commenced under the said Acts are hereby repealed.

2. Any person having or deeming himself to have any just Claimant may petition Governor.

Nature of relief afforded by judgment.

5. In any action or suit under this Act all necessary judgments decrees and orders may be given and made and shall include every species of relief whether by way of specific performance or restitution of rights or recovery of lands or chattels or payment of money or damages.

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6. In any action or suit by the Crown or Attorney General on behalf of the Crown costs shall follow or may be awarded as in an ordinary case between subject and subject.

Treasurer to pay damages awarded. 7. The Colonial Treasurer shall pay all damages or costs adjudged against any such nominal defendant or against the Crown 10 or Attorney General under this Act out of any moneys in his hands for the time being legally applicable thereto or which may hereafter be voted by Parliament for that purpose and in the event of such payment not being duly made within sixty days after demand execution may be had for the amount and the same be levied upon any property 15 vested in the Government of this Colony.

8. The Judges of the Supreme Court may make general rules

not inconsistent with this Act for carrying the same into effect and such rules on being published in the *Gazette* shall have the force of law provided that copies of all such rules shall be laid before both 20

Houses of Parliament within seven days after publication thereof or if Parliament be not sitting then within seven days after the commencement of the Session next following such publication and if either House shall at any time by resolution disapprove of such rules or any
