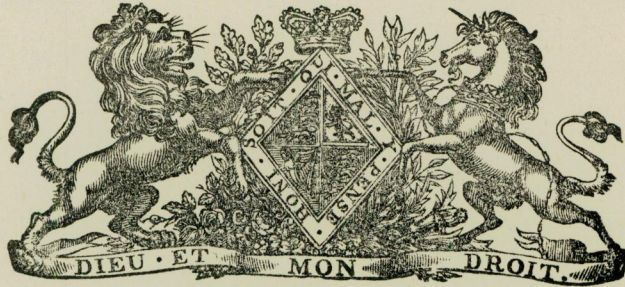

**W**HEREAS doubts have been entertained whether by the Customs Preamble.  
Act of 1865 the additional duties thereby imposed on the  
goods therein referred to were made chargeable on goods then in bond  
and whereas it was intended by the said Act to make all such goods

have been levied and paid upon such goods then in bond and it is  
expedient and necessary to stay and prevent proceedings against persons  
concerned in levying and collecting the said duties and to make valid  
such levying and collecting Be it declared and enacted by the  
10 Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent  
of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South  
Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as  
follows :—

1. All duties which previous to the passing of this Act may Legalizing duties  
15 have been collected levied or received as hereinbefore mentioned on already collected.

be and be taken to have been as lawfully levied collected and received  
as if the same had been expressly imposed by the authority of the said

An Act to amend the law relating to the registration of births, marriages, and deaths in New South Wales.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the law relating to the registration of births, marriages, and deaths in New South Wales should be amended in certain respects, and it is the duty of the Governor in Council to give effect to the provisions of the Act of 1877, in relation to the registration of births, marriages, and deaths in New South Wales, and it is therefore enacted that the provisions of the Act of 1877, in relation to the registration of births, marriages, and deaths in New South Wales, shall have effect as if they were contained in this Act.

Enacted at Sydney this 15th day of May 1877.
