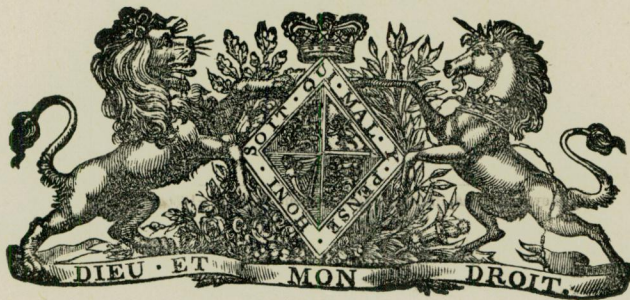

An Act for the more effectual Punishment of Drunkards.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the more effectual Punishment of Drunkards Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. Any person who shall be found drunk in any highway street road or public place shall be liable on conviction as hereinafter mentioned to a fine or penalty not exceeding twenty shillings. Drunkards may be fined.
- 10 2. Any person who shall be found drunk and disorderly in any highway street road or public place shall be liable on conviction as hereinafter mentioned to a fine or penalty not exceeding forty shillings. Drunk and disorderly persons may be fined.
- 15 3. It shall be lawful for any constable to apprehend and confine in any watch-house until he can be taken before a Justice of the Peace to be dealt with as hereinafter mentioned any person whom he shall find drunk or drunk and disorderly in any highway street road or public place. Drunk or drunk and disorderly persons may be apprehended.
- 20 4. It shall be lawful for any Justice of the Peace before whom any person shall be taken as aforesaid and charged without any formal information with a breach of either of the first two sections of this Act to inquire into and adjudicate upon such charge in a summary way. Drunk or drunk and disorderly persons to be convicted in a summary way.

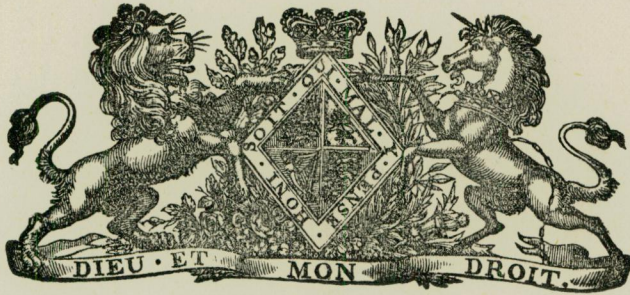

An Act for the more effectual Punishment of Drunkards.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the more effectual Punishment of Drunkards Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. Any person who shall be found drunk in any highway street road or public place shall be liable on conviction as hereinafter mentioned to a fine or penalty not exceeding twenty shillings. Drunkards may be fined.
- 10 2. Any person who shall be found drunk and disorderly in any highway street road or public place shall be liable on conviction as hereinafter mentioned to a fine or penalty not exceeding forty shillings. Drunk and disorderly persons may be fined.
- 15 3. It shall be lawful for any constable to apprehend and confine in any watch-house until he can be taken before a Justice of the Peace to be dealt with as hereinafter mentioned any person whom he shall find drunk or drunk and disorderly in any highway street road or public place. Drunk or drunk and disorderly persons may be apprehended.
- 20 4. It shall be lawful for any Justice of the Peace before whom any person shall be taken as aforesaid and charged without any formal information with a breach of either of the first two sections of this Act to inquire into and adjudicate upon such charge in a summary way. Drunk or drunk and disorderly persons to be convicted in a summary way.

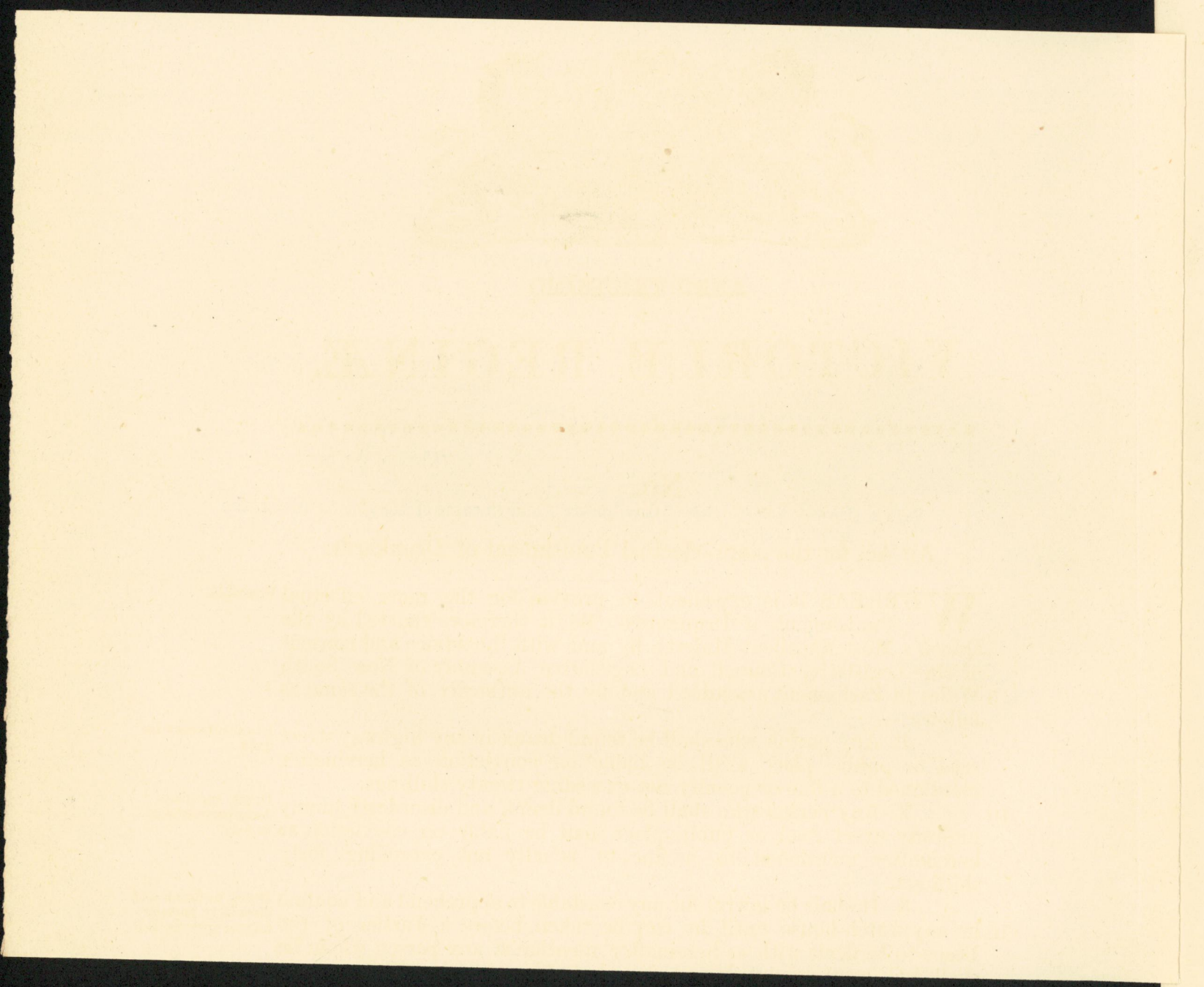

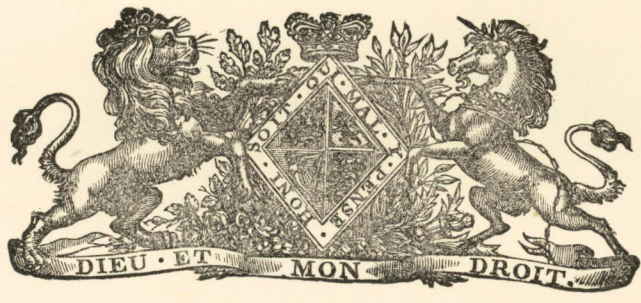

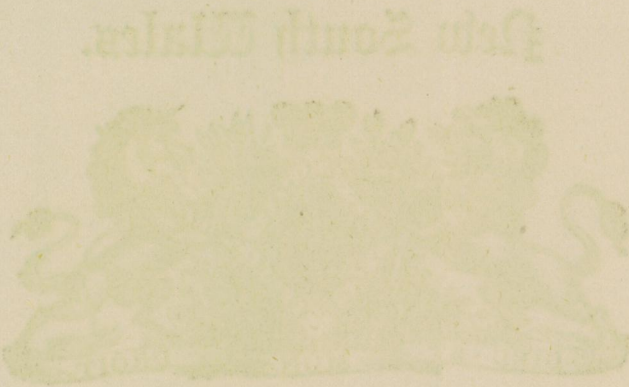
