of the husband or wife of the predecessor. 2. Nothing in the said Act shall be held to have charged or to Descendant of a charge with a higher rate of duty than five per cent. any legacy or brother or sister not residue or part or share of any residue which shall have been or shall higher rate of duty be given or shall have passed or shall pass to or for the benefit of any than five per cent descendant of a brother or sister of the father or mother of the deceased.
