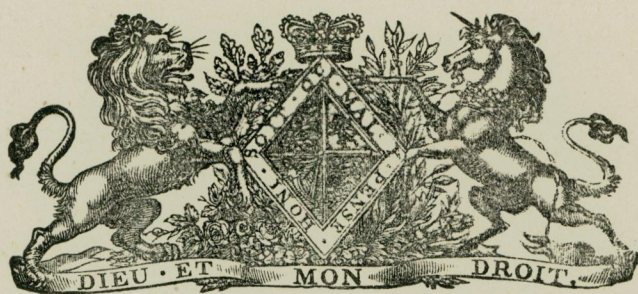

**W**HEREAS it is expedient for the protection of the public health Preamble.  
that burials in any burial ground or place of burial in Sydney  
should be discontinued and whereas a suitable and convenient  
place has been provided situate at Haslam's Creek where the bodies  
5 of those who shall die in Sydney or its vicinity can be conveniently  
buried Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty  
by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and  
Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled  
and by the authority of the same as follows:—

10 1. On and after the first day of January one thousand eight  
hundred and sixty-seven all burials in the burial grounds or places  
of burial within the City of Sydney shall be discontinued Provided  
always that in case where there is on such day any exclusive right of  
interment in any vault or enclosure of any such burial grounds or  
15 places of burial purchased or acquired it shall be lawful for the  
Municipal Council of the City of Sydney on application being made to  
them and on their being satisfied that the exercise of such right will  
not be injurious to health to grant a license for the exercise of such  
right during such time and subject to such conditions and restrictions  
20 as such Council may think fit.

Interments in burial grounds in Sydney to be discontinued after a particular day. Proviso.

*Sydney Burial Grounds.*

2. If any person not having such license shall after the day mentioned in the preceding section knowingly and wilfully bury any body or in anywise act or assist in the burial of any body within the limits for which burials have by the last preceding section been prohibited every person so offending shall upon summary conviction thereof forfeit a penalty or sum not exceeding twenty pounds.

Penalty for disobedience.

3. Every penalty imposed for any offence against this Act may be sued for and recovered in a summary way before any two Justices of the Peace.

Recovery of penalties.

10 4. This Act shall be styled and cited as the "Sydney Burial Grounds Act 1866."

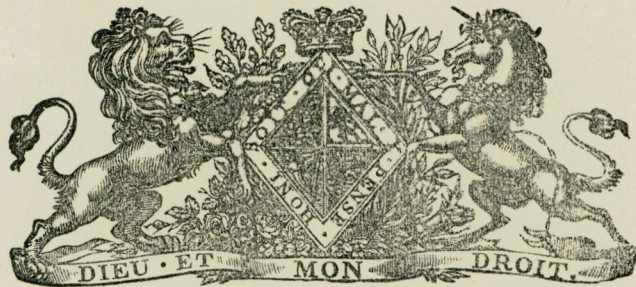

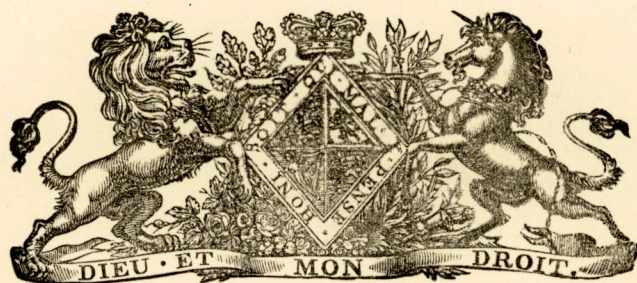

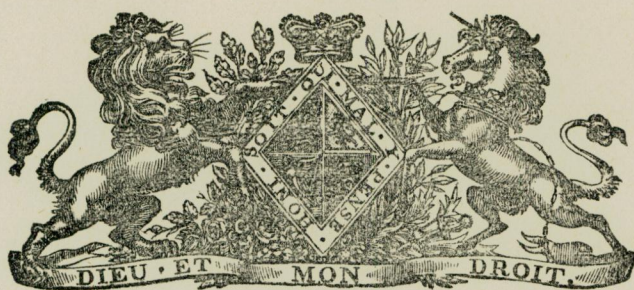
