
A BILL

To authorize the resumption and enclosure of a portion of Union-street in the City of Goulburn.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the portion hereinafter described Preamble.
of the street known as Union-street in the City of Goulburn should be stopped as a public highway and that the right of way thereover hitherto enjoyed by the public should be extinguished in order that Her Majesty may be enabled to resume the land forming portion of such street as aforesaid absolutely free and clear of such right of way Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled

WHEREAS it is expedient that the portion hereinafter described ^{Preamble.} of the street known as Union-street in the City of Goulburn should be stopped as a public highway and that the right of way thereover hitherto enjoyed by the public should be extinguished in order that Her Majesty may be enabled to resume the land forming portion of such street as aforesaid absolutely free and clear of such right of way Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1.
