An Act to reduce the Salaries of certain Public Officers.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to reduce the Salaries of certain Public Preamble.  
Officers Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent  
Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled  
5 and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. The Act twentieth Victoria number eighteen and so much of Repeal of certain  
existing Salaries.  
Schedule A to the Constitution Act of 1855 as provides for the Salary  
of any future Governor and for the Salaries of the Colonial Secretary—  
the Colonial Treasurer—the Attorney General—the Solicitor General—  
10 and the Auditor General are hereby repealed.

2. There shall be charged upon and paid out of the Consolidated New Salaries of  
certain Public  
Officers.  
Revenue Fund in each and every year to the Public Officers specified  
below the several Salaries set against their names respectively —

	The Governor .....	£5,000
15	The Colonial Secretary .....	1,250
	The Colonial Treasurer .....	1,250
	The Attorney General .....	1,250
	The Secretary for Lands .....	1,250
	The Secretary for Works .....	1,250
20	The Solicitor General.....	1,000
	The Auditor General .....	900

3. Nothing herein contained shall affect the Salary of the present Provision for Salary  
of present Governor.

4. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Official Short title.
