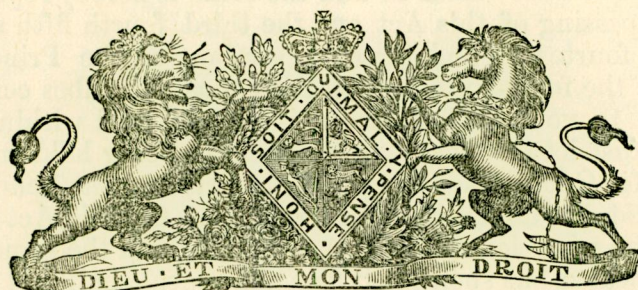

An Act to make better provision for the Representation of the People in the Legislative Assembly.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient that better provision should be made for the Representation of the People in the Legislative Assembly by sub-dividing the Colony into an increased number of Electoral Districts and also to amend the "Electoral Act of 1858" in certain respects Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. This Act shall be read with and as forming part of the "Electoral Act of 1858" hereinafter termed the "Principal Act" which together with and as amended by this Act may be cited as the "Electoral Acts 1858—1874" And this Act when specifically meant or referred to may be cited as the "Electoral Act Amendment Act of 1874."

2. The provisions contained in the fifth sixth seventh eighth ninth tenth eleventh sixteenth seventeenth eighteenth and nineteenth sections of this Act shall come into force on the date of the expiration

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(whether



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(whether by efflux of time or dissolution) of the present Parliament and the remaining provisions of this Act shall come into force on the day of the passing thereof. Provided that all the provisions of the Principal Act as amended by this Act regulating or referring to the collection of Electoral Lists and Rolls shall for the purpose of compiling such lists and rolls for the Electoral Districts mentioned in the sixth section hereof and described in the First Schedule hereto come into force on the passing of this Act. And collectors of Electoral Lists for Police Districts shall for such purpose be appointed by the Courts of Petty Sessions of such Police Districts on or before the first day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four and on or before the same day in each succeeding year.

3. The words and expressions in inverted commas in the first section of the Principal Act shall wheresoever occurring in this Act bear the same constructions respectively for the purposes thereof as are assigned to them in the said section of the Principal Act for the purposes of that Act.

4. The Act thirtieth Victoria number twenty-one being the "Electoral Roll Act of 1866" shall be and the same is hereby repealed from and after the passing of this Act and the third fourth fifth sixth seventh thirteenth fourteenth and fifteenth sections of the Principal Act and so much of the forty-sixth section thereof as prescribes certain forms of questions to voters where there is a gold field within the boundaries of the district for which an election is being held and to voters at elections for Gold Fields electoral districts and the Schedule marked B to the said Act annexed and so much of the said Act as is inconsistent with the provisions of this Act shall be and the same are likewise hereby repealed but such lastly enacted repeal shall not take effect until the day of the commencement of this Act nor shall any repeal in this section enacted affect any election proclamation appointment proceeding matter or thing done or commenced under or by virtue of any of the said repealed enactments. Provided also that the Gold Fields Electoral Districts and provisions incidental thereto constituted by and contained in the said Principal Act shall for the purposes of any election of Members of Mining Boards to be held after the passing of this Act continue and be in force as if this Act had not been passed.

5. New South Wales shall be divided into the seventy-eight Electoral Districts following that is to say:—

20 And the boundaries of each of the said Electoral Districts shall be those respectively set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

6. The Electoral Districts of East and West Sydney shall each return four Members The Electoral Districts of Argyle—Braidwood—Apportionment of Members. Canterbury—Central Cumberland—Forbes—Liverpool Plains—and  
25 East Macquarie shall each return two Members And all the other Electoral Districts shall each return one Member to serve in the Assembly Provided always that the number of Members herein respectively assigned to such districts shall be subject to the provisions of the next three following sections.

30 7. Subject to the conditions and provisions hereinafter in the tenth section contained every Electoral District (other than the Electoral Districts of East and West Sydney) entitled under the provisions of the next preceding section to return two Members to serve in the Assembly shall so soon as the number of electors on the  
35 electoral roll for the time being of such Electoral District shall have reached five thousand be and continue to be entitled as hereinafter mentioned to return one additional Member to serve in the Assembly.

8. Subject to the aforesaid conditions and provisions every Electoral District so entitled as aforesaid to return one Member only to  
40 serve in the said Assembly shall so soon as the number of electors on the electoral roll for the time being of such Electoral District shall have reached three thousand be and continue to be entitled as in the said section mentioned to return one additional Member to serve in the Assembly.

45 9. No Electoral District shall be entitled to return an additional Member under the provisions of either of the last two preceding sections until the Governor shall by Proclamation to be published in the *Gazette* have declared that such district is entitled by reason of the number of electors thereof on the electoral roll for the time-being  
50 having reached the number hereinbefore in that behalf prescribed to return an additional Member in pursuance of the provisions of this Act And such Proclamation shall be issued so soon as practicable after it shall appear to the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council that the number of electors on the roll for the time-being for such  
55 district has reached the number hereinbefore prescribed and has not during the then next preceding twenty-four calendar months been less than the said prescribed number by at least one-third thereof Provided always that the first writ for the election of any such additional Member shall be issued by the Governor and not for any election  
except

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except a General Election And all subsequent writs shall be issued in manner provided by the Principal Act for election writs Provided further that if at any subsequent issue of writs for a General Election it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Governor with the advice  
 5 aforesaid that the number of electors on the electoral roll for the time being of any Electoral District which under the provisions hereinbefore contained shall have returned an additional Member to serve for such district has fallen below the number so hereinbefore prescribed by not less than one thousand names then the Governor  
 10 shall issue his writ for the return only of that number of Members at such General Election to which such Electoral District is entitled under the seventh section of this Act.

Provision on reduction of roll.

10. So much of section eight of the Principal Act as is contained in the following words viz. "who being a naturalised subject shall  
 15 have resided in this Colony for five years" and so much of section nine of the said Act as is contained in the following words viz. "who being a naturalised subject shall have resided in this Colony for three years" shall be repealed and in lieu thereof in each of the said sections there shall be substituted the words following viz.—"who shall have  
 20 become a naturalised subject and shall thereafter have resided in this Colony for two years."

Qualification of Members and Electors.

11. It shall be lawful for the Court of Petty Sessions of every Police District to appoint a member of the Police Force to be and perform the duties of Collector of Electoral Lists in and for such  
 25 district and to appoint so many Assistant Collectors being also members of the said Force for such District as such Court may think requisite And all the provisions with reference to the collection of such lists in the said Principal Act contained and all the duties obligations privileges rights powers and authorities thereby conferred on Collectors shall  
 30 except for the purposes of the fourteenth section of this Act and except as hereinafter excepted be applicable to and be performed exercised incurred and possessed by every such member of the Police Force upon his appointment as such Collector or Assistant Collector Provided always that nothing in this section contained shall entitle or  
 35 be taken to entitle any member of the Police Force so appointed as aforesaid to any remuneration for the performance of any or all of the duties attaching to the said office and employment anything in the said Principal Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

Members of Police Force may be appointed Collectors &c. of Electoral Lists.

12. The several days and times hereinafter in this section set  
 40 forth shall be and they are hereby declared to be respectively substituted and appointed in lieu of the several corresponding days and times appointed by the said Principal Act viz. :—In lieu of the words "first and the twenty-eighth day of January" in the seven-  
 45 teenth section of the said Act contained the words "first and twenty-eighth day of June" shall be substituted and in lieu of the words "twenty-eighth day of February" in the seventeenth and twenty-first sections of the said Act contained and repeated the words  
 "twenty-eighth day of August" shall be substituted—and in lieu of the words "eighteenth day of March" in the said last-mentioned  
 50 section contained the words "eighteenth day of September" shall be substituted—in lieu of the words "eighteenth and twenty-eighth days of March" in the twenty-second section of the said Act the words  
 "eighteenth and twenty-eighth days of September" shall be substituted—in lieu of the words "twenty-eighth day of March" in the  
 55 twenty-fifth section of the said Act the words "twenty-eighth day of September" shall be substituted—and in lieu of the words "twelfth day of April" thrice contained or referred to in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act the words "twelfth day of October shall in each case be substituted and any further change of time rendered necessary by  
 the

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the said substitutions and appointments or any of them may for the purposes of this Act be lawfully made And all the provisions and requirements of the said Principal Act shall be read construed and complied with as if the several days and times hereinbefore substituted and appointed as aforesaid had been by the said Act originally declared and enacted but so that nothing herein contained shall in any way affect any act matter or thing done or purporting to be done in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act.

13. The Collector of every Police District shall transmit a  
 10 copy of the alphabetical list of persons qualified to vote for the  
 election of Members of the Assembly required by law to be made  
 by him between the first and the twenty-eighth day of June in  
 each year to the Government Printer who shall cause the same to be  
 printed and shall forward a copy thereof to the said Collector who shall  
 15 forthwith compare it with the list in his possession and make such  
 corrections therein as may be necessary in order that the same shall  
 correspond accurately with the said list And the said Collector after  
 having so examined such printed copy and made such corrections  
 therein (if any) as may be necessary shall sign and deliver the same to  
 20 the Clerk of Petty Sessions of the Police District for which such  
 Collector is appointed and the copy so signed and delivered shall be the  
 copy to be dealt with by such Clerk of Petty Sessions according to the  
 provisions of the seventeenth section of the Principal Act as amended  
 by this Act And all such copies thereof as may be required by the  
 25 Clerk of Petty Sessions for sale or publication as required by the said  
 seventeenth section shall be supplied by the Government Printer  
 Provided always that in case the said printed copy shall not be  
 forwarded by the Government Printer as aforesaid to the said Collector  
 or shall not reach him in due time as hereinbefore provided the said  
 30 Collector shall make out a copy of the list in his possession and  
 deliver such copy to the Clerk of Petty Sessions for the purposes of  
 the said Principal Act.

14. In every Electoral District every Clerk of Petty Sessions  
 shall on or before the twelfth day of October in each year deliver  
 35 the lists revised as required by the Principal Act to the Returning  
 Officer of the Electoral District to which the same belong And such  
 Returning Officer after having received the list or lists of the electors  
 for the whole of such Electoral District shall forthwith transmit such  
 list or lists or copies thereof to the Government Printer to be compiled  
 40 by him in the form of a general alphabetical roll of the Electors  
 of the whole Electoral District numbered in regular arithmetical  
 order Provided that when any Electoral District shall comprise more  
 than one Police District or portion of a Police District the names  
 of the electors of each such Police District or portion of a Police  
 45 District shall be placed together in alphabetical order according to the  
 form and arrangement shewn in the Second Schedule hereto so as to  
 form a distinct division within the same roll and each such division  
 shall be designated by the name of the Police District to which it  
 belongs and the numbering in regular arithmetical order hereinbefore  
 50 prescribed shall be preserved throughout such roll And if in any  
 year the roll for any Electoral District shall not be made out or dealt  
 with as required by law or shall not be perfected the last duly completed  
 roll shall wholly or in part as the case may require be used as the roll  
 for that year And such electoral roll so compiled shall be the roll of  
 55 electors for each Electoral District for the period intervening between  
 the twelfth day of October next ensuing and the thirty-first day of  
 December in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five  
 and thereafter in every subsequent year such roll shall be the roll of  
 electors as aforesaid from the first day of January to the thirty-first  
 day

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day of December both inclusive And every such roll shall during any such period as aforesaid be conclusive evidence of the title to vote of each elector therein named unless he be disqualified or incapacitated by any of the causes mentioned in the Principal Act.

5 15. All Writs for General Elections to the Assembly shall be issued within two clear days after the publication in the *Gazette* of the Proclamation dissolving Parliament. Writs for General Elections when to be issued.

10 16. Such Writs shall in every case be made returnable on a day not later than the thirty-fifth clear day after the date of the issue thereof. When returnable.

17. The day to be fixed for the meeting of Parliament after the return of such Writs shall not be later than the seventh clear day after the date on which such Writs shall have been made returnable as aforesaid. When Parliament to meet after return of Writs.

15 18. At every future nomination of persons to serve in the Assembly it shall be necessary to the validity of such nomination that each candidate shall be proposed and seconded by persons who are qualified to vote at such election. Candidate to be proposed and seconded by duly qualified electors.

20 19. No person shall be capable of being elected a Member of the Legislative Assembly who shall have taken the benefit of any Act for the relief of insolvent debtors until he shall have obtained a certificate of discharge under the said Act or until his estate shall have been duly released from sequestration. Uncertificated insolvent incapable of being elected.

25 20. So much of the seventy-fifth section of the Principal Act as prescribes the period of eight weeks after the return of writs within which petitions embodying any of the causes of complaint mentioned in the said section shall be presented to the Governor or Speaker shall be and the same is hereby repealed And from and after the date of the passing of this Act the period within which every such petition shall be so presented shall be limited to twenty-one clear days after the day of the return of the writ to which such petition shall relate And no writ for a new election for a seat vacated by acceptance of office under the nineteenth section of the Act eighteenth and nineteenth Victoria chapter fifty-four shall be issued until after the expiration of twenty-one days from the date of the return of the writ certifying the election of the Member whose seat had so become vacant as aforesaid. ## FIRST SCHEDULE.

## 1. ARGYLE.

Embracing the county of Argyle a north-eastern portion of the county of King  
 5 and the southern portions of the counties of Georgiana and Westmoreland and bounded  
 on the north from the confluence of Murruin or Settler's Creek with the Wollondilly  
 River by that creek to its head at Mount Murruin by the range thence to the main head  
 of the Abercrombie River east of Mount Werong and by the Abercrombie River down-  
 wards to the confluence of the Bolong River thence on the west by the range forming  
 10 the western watershed of the Bolong River and dividing its waters from those of Cook's  
 Vale Creek and the range dividing the waters of the Abercrombie and Crookwell Rivers  
 to a source of Kangaloola Creek at the village reserve and by that creek to its confluence  
 with the Crookwell River by the Crookwell River downwards to the junction of the  
 Lachlan River thence on the west by that river upwards to the junction of Grabben  
 15 Gullen Creek thence on the south by the southern watershed of that creek easterly and  
 a line east to the south-west corner of J. Tully's conditional purchase portion one parish  
 of Lampton county of King thence by the south boundary of that portion easterly to its  
 south-east corner and thence by a line south and the west boundaries of portions twenty-  
 three and twenty-two of the aforesaid parish southerly and the south boundary of  
 20 portion twenty-two easterly and the west and south boundaries of portion twenty-one  
 southerly and easterly to the west boundary of A. Turner's two thousand five  
 hundred and sixty acres "Gurrunda" thence again on the west by that boundary  
 southerly and by the range dividing the eastern and western waters and the Cullarin  
 Range to Lake George on the south by Lake George to the village reserve at Kenny's  
 25 thence by a small gully descending to the lake to the Alianoyonyiga Mountain and by  
 the ridge thence extending south-easterly to Mount Wollowolar and thence by Boro  
 Creek to the Shoalhaven River on the east by the Shoalhaven River downwards to the  
 confluence of Barber's Creek thence by Barber's Creek to its source and by a line bearing  
 north-easterly to Uringalla Creek and by that creek Paddy's River and the Wollondilly  
 30 River downwards to the confluence of Murruin or Settler's Creek aforesaid But  
 excluding therefrom the Electoral District of Goulburn.

## 2. ALBURY.

County of Goulburn Bounded on the east from the Murray River by the eastern  
 and northern boundaries of the parish of Bowna as shown on map of the county of  
 35 Goulburn at the Surveyor General's Office Sydney being the eastern and northern  
 boundaries of J. Hore's portion one hundred and ten parish of Bowna northerly and  
 westerly and a line west to its intersection with the southerly prolongation of the  
 eastern boundary of portion one hundred and forty of that parish thence by that pro-  
 longation and that boundary northerly to the north-east corner of that portion thence  
 40 the north boundaries of portions one hundred and forty aforesaid one hundred and eleven  
 six seven nineteen twenty twenty-one thirty thirty-one fifty-three to the north-west  
 corner of the latter portion thence the western boundaries of portions fifty-three and fifty-  
 two southerly to the north-east corner of portion ninety-six and thence the north bound-  
 aries of portions ninety-six ninety-seven and one hundred one hundred and one and one  
 45 hundred and four to the road from Albury to Table-top Creek thence by part of the  
 western boundary of that parish being that road southerly to the north-east corner of J.  
 M'Laurin's portion fifty-nine parish Mungabarina thence by the north boundary of that  
 parish being the north boundary of that portion westerly the western boundary of portion  
 sixty-four parish of Jindera northerly the southern of portion sixty-one of that parish  
 50 westerly to the Albury and Gerogery Road thence by that road southerly to the north-  
 eastern corner of A. Heriot's portion fifty-eight thence the northern and western bound-  
 aries of that portion westerly and southerly the southern boundary of A. Heriot's portion  
 one parish of Jindera westerly and its continuation westerly and thence by the eastern  
 southern and western boundaries of portion two hundred and twenty-two of that parish  
 55 southerly westerly and northerly and the southern and western boundaries of portion  
 two hundred and twenty-three westerly and northerly to the range dividing Eight-mile  
 Creek from Four-mile Creek thence by the range dividing those creeks southerly and the  
 range forming the northern watershed of Bungambrawatha Creek and Splitter's Creek  
 south-westerly and westerly to Corner Hill at the western boundary of the county of  
 60 Goulburn thence on the west by part of the western boundary of that county southerly  
 to the Murray River and thence on the south and again on the east by that river upwards  
 to the point of commencement.



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## 3. ARMIDALE.

Embracing part of the county of Sandon Bounded on the east from the south-eastern corner of P. Charlton's conditional purchase of two hundred acres on Tilbuster Ponds portion ten parish of Donald by Tilbuster Ponds downwards to the south-eastern corner of that portion and its continuation to the eastern boundary of portion four hundred and thirty-nine of that parish thence by the eastern boundary of that portion and portions four hundred and thirty-eight four hundred and twenty-eight four hundred and twenty-seven four hundred and twenty-four four hundred and twenty-three and four hundred and twenty-two of that parish and by the eastern boundaries of H. Dangar's one hundred and sixty acres and portions two hundred and fifty-four two hundred and fifty-three two hundred and fifty-two two hundred and fifty-one two hundred and forty-nine two hundred and forty-eight two hundred and forty-seven two hundred and forty-two hundred and thirty-nine two hundred and thirty-eight two hundred and thirty-seven two hundred and thirty-six two hundred and thirty-five parish of Saumarez and a continuation of that line to Saumarez Creek thence by that creek to Salisbury Waters and by Salisbury Waters upwards to its source thence on the south and on the west by the range forming the southern and western watershed of Kentucky Ponds and Saumarez Creek and the Rocky River and a line northerly to the confluence of Boorolong Creek 20 with the Rocky River and thence by that creek upwards to a point one mile and a quarter above Swamp Oak Creek thence on the north by a line easterly to the south-west corner of portion thirty-one parish of Dumaresq and by the south boundary of that portion and its easterly prolongation to the south-east corner of portion thirty of that parish on the Inverell Road and thence by that road south-easterly to the south- 25 west corner of portion eleven and thence by a line east forming partly the south boundaries of that portion and portions twelve fourteen twenty-four twenty and twenty-one of that parish to the point of commencement.

## 4. ALEXANDRIA.

County of Cumberland Bounded on the north from the sea by the southern 30 boundary of the Light-house Reserve being a dividing boundary between the boroughs of Woollahra and Waverley westerly to the Old South Head Road and thence by that road south-westerly and westerly to the Moore Park Road and thence by that road westerly to Dowling-street and thence on the west by that street southerly to Cleveland-street and thence by the western boundaries of the boroughs of Redfern and Waterloo 35 southerly to the south-eastern corner of the borough of Waterloo thence again on the north by the south boundary of that borough westerly to the Botany Road thence again on the east by that road northerly to the south boundary of the borough of Redfern thence on the north-west and west by the northern and western boundaries of the borough of Alexandria south-westerly southerly westerly and again southerly to the 40 south-west corner of that borough thence by part of its southern boundary to Shea's Creek and thence by Shea's Creek and Cook's River to Botany Bay and on the south and on the east by that bay to the sea and by the sea northerly to the point of commencement.

## 5. BALMAIN.

County of Cumberland parish of Petersham Bounded on the south from White's 45 Creek by the Parramatta Road westerly to Long Cove Creek on the west by that creek northerly to Long Cove and on all other sides by the waters of Port Jackson north-easterly south-easterly and south-westerly to White's Creek aforesaid and by that creek upwards to the Parramatta Road aforesaid.

## 6. BATHURST.

Embracing the town of Bathurst in the county of Bathurst and bounded on the south from the Macquarie River by the north boundary of James Vincent's grant of sixty-two acres to the Vale Creek by that creek upwards to the north boundary of Sir John Jamison's one hundred acres and by the north boundary of Sir John Jamison's 55 one hundred acres forming the south side of Busby-street westerly to Havannah-street by the extension of Havannah-street south-westerly forming the north-west boundaries of Austin's Crilly's Thompson's and Mutton's purchases by the north boundaries of William Mutton's eleven acres one rood and twenty-three perches and David Gordon's eighteen acres and eleven perches and by the westerly extension of that line to the east boundary of Colonel Stewart's grant on the west by that boundary northerly to the 60 south-west corner of T. J. Hawkins' three hundred and twenty acres on part of the north by the south boundaries of that land and of James Blackett's three hundred and twenty acres and James Walker's three hundred and twenty acres easterly to the south-east corner of Walker's three hundred and twenty acres again on the west by part of the 65 east boundary of that land again on the north by the south boundary of J. Medley's one hundred acres again on the west by the east boundary of that one hundred acres northerly to the Macquarie River again on the north and on the east by the Macquarie River upwards to the north boundary of James Vincent's sixty-two acres aforesaid.



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## 7. THE BARWON.

Embracing the pastoral district of Warrego and parts of the pastoral districts of Bligh Wellington and Albert and bounded on the north by part of the boundary-line dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and Queensland from the Barwon River

5 westerly to a point five miles west from the Paroo River thence on the west by the western or back boundaries of all the runs fronting to the western side of the Paroo River southerly to the northern boundary of Mullawoolka West Run by that boundary westerly and by the east north and west boundaries of Tungo Run northerly westerly and southerly to Tungo Creek thence by the west boundary of Tungo South Run

10 southerly to its south-west corner thence by the western boundary of Yentabangee Run southerly to the north-western corner of East Perri Run thence by the western boundary of East Perri Run southerly and the west boundary of Bathing Springs Run southerly to its south-west corner thence by three miles of the southern boundary of that run easterly to its intersection with the north-westerly prolongation of the

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seven hundred and twenty-six and one thousand and fifty-six acres to the confluence of Guangua Creek with the Wybong Creek thence by a line westerly to the south-east corner of W. Hall's easternmost six hundred and forty acres by the southern eastern and southern boundaries of Hall's land westerly southerly and again westerly exclusive

 20 boundary of that borough to Shea's Creek and thence by Shea's Creek Cook's River and Botany Bay southerly to George's River on the south by that river upwards on the west by the western boundary of the parishes of St George and Concord to the Parramatta River on the north by the Parramatta River and waters of Port Jackson and Long Cove and Long Cove Creek to the Parramatta Road and thence by that road easterly to Johnston's  
 25 Creek at the point of commencement.

## 16. THE CLARENCE.

County of Cumberland parish of Petersham Bounded on the south from White's Creek by the Parramatta Road easterly to Johnston's Creek by Johnston's Creek to Orphan School Creek by that creek upwards to the Parramatta Road and thence again  
 5 by that road easterly to Bay-street on the east by Bay-street northerly to Blackwattle Swamp on the north by the waters of Port Jackson to White's Creek and on the west by White's Creek southerly to Parramatta Road aforesaid.

## 26. GLEN INNES.

Embracing parts of the pastoral district of New England and Clarence and  
 10 bounded on the north from the Nymboi or Mitchell River by a line bearing west to the Bolivia Range thence by the Great Dividing Range and the range forming the northern watershed of the Severn River westerly to its intersection with a line forming the northerly prolongation of the western boundary of H. Gordon's one hundred and  
 15 the Severn River and thence by a line bearing south to the eastern watershed of the Arrawatta Creek thence by the range dividing the waters falling to Arrawatta Creek King's Plains Creek Swan Brook and the Macintyre River from those falling to Cameron's Creek Wellingrove Creek and the Beardy Waters tributaries of the Severn River southerly to the northern watershed of Clark's Creek thence on the south by that  
 20 watershed to Ben Lomond and thence by the range forming the southern watershed of the Clarence River south-easterly to its intersection with a line bearing north from Mount Werrikimbe and thence on the east by that line bearing north to the intersection with the line bearing east from the Bolivia Range aforesaid and again on the north by that line bearing west to the point of commencement.

Gibson's two thousand five hundred and sixty acres to the north-west corner of that grant thence by the south boundary of A. Gibson's eight hundred and eighteen acres and its westerly continuation to the  
 40 Goulburn and Gunning Road and thence by that road to the east boundary of J. Chisholm's six hundred and forty acres on the west by that boundary and the east boundary of Mrs. Chisholm's one thousand two hundred and eighty acres northerly to the south-west corner of A. Kinghorne's two thousand acres thence by the south and west boundaries of R. C. Cartwright's one thousand two hundred and eighty acres  
 45 westerly and northerly to the Wollondilly River thence crossing that river by that river to the boundary dividing D. J. Ross's two thousand acres from W. G. and H. Gaymore's two thousand acres thence by that boundary and its northerly prolongation about seven and one-quarter miles in all to a point in a line west with the north boundary of F. Embracing part of the pastoral district of Lachlan and bounded on the north from the confluence of the Boorowa River with the Lachlan River by the Lachlan River downwards to the confluence of a small creek with that river at Booabungril from Cudgallagong Lake thence on the south-west by a line south-east to the range dividing the waters flowing to the Murrumbidgee River from those flowing to the Lachlan River thence on the south by that range easterly to where the spur branches which forms the western watershed of Walladilly Creek thence by that watershed and the western watershed of Narraburra Creek northerly to the junction of the latter creek with the Yeo Yeo Creek thence by the Morangarell and Burrangong Road easterly to where the north-western boundary of the Burrangong Gold Field as proclaimed the thirty-first August one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five crosses it at about two and three-quarters miles westerly from Thuddungara Lagoon thence by the north-western boundary of that Gold Field being a line bearing north-east to the Burrangong Creek at P. Campbell's one hundred and sixty acres at Lagoon Station thence by the marked tree boundary dividing the counties of Monteagle and Forbes easterly to Crowther or Koorowatha Creek thence by that creek downwards to the confluence of Bang Bang Creek thence by that creek upwards to the boundary dividing portion 0-6 and 0-7 parish of Koorowatha on that creek thence by part of the north-western boundary of the suburban lands at Koorowatha defined by notice in *Government Gazette* number seventy-three twenty-eighth April one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three folio nine hundred and eighty-six bearing north forty degrees east about twelve chains and thence by the north-eastern boundary of those lands bearing east forty degrees south about seventy-nine chains thence by part of the south-eastern boundary of those lands bearing south forty degrees west to the northern corner of P. Maloney's portion 0 over five thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that portion and W. Embracing the greater portion of the pastoral district of Gwydir Bounded on the south from the western boundary of the pastoral district of New England by the boundary dividing the pastoral districts of Gwydir and Liverpool Plains westerly and 5 north-westerly to the Barwon River on the west and on the north by the Barwon the Macintyre and the Dumaresq Rivers upwards being partly the boundary dividing the colonies New South Wales and Queensland to the boundary dividing Goonian and Bonshaw Runs thence on the east by a line south-westerly to the junction of Myall Creek with the Severn River thence by a line south-westerly to the Macintyre River at the junction of 10 Bill's Gully thence by the Macintyre River southerly to Redbank Creek thence by the western boundaries of Redbank and Bannockburn Runs southerly and the range dividing the Macintyre and Gwydir Rivers and the range forming the eastern watershed of Myall Creek a tributary of the Gwydir River southerly and the western watershed of Auburn Vale Creek southerly to the confluence of Auburn Vale or Cope's Creek with the 15 Bundarra or Gwydir River and thence by part of the western boundary of the Pastoral District of New England southerly to the point of commencement.

## 32. HARTLEY.

Embracing the eastern portion of the county of Phillip the northern portion of the county of Roxburgh the western portions of the Counties of Hunter and Cook the 20 central portion of the county of Westmoreland and the north-eastern portion of the county of Georgiana and bounded on the north by the Goulburn River downwards from the confluence of Bylong Creek to that of Widdin Creek thence on the east by Widdin Creek to its head at Mount Coricudgy thence by the Great Dividing Range and the range forming the eastern watershed of Umbiella Creek to the Colo River at Sir 25 John's Mouth thence again on the north by the Colo River downward to the confluence of Wallanganbe Creek again on the east by Wallanganbe Creek to its head and by a line south-east to King George's Mountain thence by a line to Mount Hay thence by a line to the weatherboard hut thence by Jamison's Valley Creek to Cox's River by that river upward to the confluence of Kowmung River by that river upward to the nearest source 30 to Mount Collong and by a line to that mountain on the south by the range thence by Mount Murrin to the main head of the Abererombie River east of Mount Werong and by the Abererombie River to the confluence of the Bolong River and thence on the west by a line northerly to the Isabella River at the north-east corner of Mrs. Murphy's three hundred acres at Ballyroe by the Isabella River to its head in the range dividing 35 the waters of the Abererombie and Campbell's River by that range easterly to the head of Fish River Creek by that creek to the Fish River and by that river downward to the confluence of Solitary Creek by Solitary Creek to Rydal where the Bathurst Road crosses that creek by that road westerly to the Great Dividing Range by that range northerly to the source of Willwa Creek by Willwa Creek to the Turon River by that river downward to 40 the confluence of Round Swamp Creek and thence by the range forming the western watershed of that creek the range forming the southern watershed of Warragunna Creek and a spur range to Cunningham's Creek opposite the confluence of the tributary falling into it from Mount Corcalgong thence on the west by the western boundary of the county of Roxburgh being Cunningham's Creek upwards a tributary which rises nearly 45 south of the head of Cudgegong Creek by a line northerly to the head of Cudgegong Creek and that creek to its confluence with the Cudgegong River thence by a line north by compass passing to the west of the village of Dungaree to the Great Dividing Range and by that range easterly and the range forming the western watershed of Bylong Creek to the confluence of that creek with the Goulburn River aforesaid.

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## 33. THE HAWKESBURY.

Embracing a south-western portion of the county of Northumberland the south-eastern portion of the county of Hunter and the north-eastern portion of the county of Cook and bounded on part of the east from the Hawkesbury River by the north road from Wiseman's Ferry to Mount M'Quoid in the range dividing the waters of the Wollombi 55 Brook from those of Mangrove and Yengo Creeks on the north by that range the range dividing the waters of Parson's Doyle's and Greig's Creeks from those of the Macdonald River to Mount Monundilla thence by the range dividing the waters of the Widdin Creek from those of James' or Baerami Creek and a spur-range to Widden Creek about three miles below the junction of Blackwater Creek on part of the west by Widdin Creek to its 60 head at Mount Corricudgy thence by the Great Dividing Range and the range forming the eastern watershed of Umbiella Creek to the Colo River at Sir John's Mouth on part of the south by the Colo River downwards to the confluence of Wollunganbe Creek again on west by Wollunganbe Creek to its source thence again on the south by a line towards Mount Hay to the River Gross by that river to its confluence with the River 65 Hawkesbury and thence on the remainder of the east by the Hawkesbury River downwards to the point of commencement.



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## 34. THE HUME.

Embracing part of the pastoral district of Murrumbidgee and bounded on the south by the boundary between New South Wales and Victoria being the Indi River downwards from its source in the Great Dividing Range to its confluence with the River Murray and by the Murray downward to a point south of Werinmunah or Woore's Hill  
 5 on the west by a line north to Woore's Hill and thence by a direct line northerly to the confluence of the Colombo and Billabong Creeks including the whole of Noweronie Run on the Billabong thence by the Colombo Creek upwards to the north boundary of Cockegedong Run on the north by north boundary of that run and the boundary line between those runs fronting on the Billabong Creek and those fronting on the  
 10 Urana Lake Urana and Urangeline Creeks and on to Wollondoon Hill thence by the leading range round the southern sources of the Urangeline Creek until it joins the range dividing the Mittagong and Yerong Creeks from Doodle Swamp Falls and Buckargina Falls until that range joins the main range between the Murray and Murrumbidgee thence by that range easterly until it joins the Great Dividing Range and on the  
 15 east by that range southerly to that source of the Indi River which divides the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria aforesaid But exclusively of the Electoral District of Albury.

## 35. THE HUNTER AND PATERSON.

Counties of Northumberland and Durham Bounded on part of the east from  
 20 Hunter River by the boundary dividing H. D. Owen's one thousand one hundred acres from Sir J. Jamison's three hundred acres County of Northumberland and the west boundary of H. Mitchell's four hundred and sixteen acres southerly to the Great Northern Road thence by that road westerly to the Toll-bar thence by the road to  
 25 Bishop's Bridge southerly to the Great Northern Railway thence on the north by that railway westerly to the boundary dividing T. Winder's one thousand acres from H. Brigg's eight hundred acres thence again on the west by that boundary southerly and the boundary dividing T. M. Winder's one thousand acres from R. Scott E. Radford A. B. Sparke and L. Duguid's two thousand acres in trust southerly by the south boundary of  
 30 that two thousand acres easterly and the west boundary of C. J. and D. Campbell's one thousand two hundred and eighty acres in trust southerly to its south-west corner thence on the south by the south boundary of that one thousand two hundred and eighty acres and its easterly prolongation to the eastern boundary of the Village Reserve thence by the boundary dividing that reserve from S. Clift's six hundred and forty acres  
 35 southerly and the south boundary of that six hundred and forty acres and S. Clift's eastern six hundred and forty acres easterly to the west boundary of T. V. Bloomfield's two thousand acres "Dagworth" and thence by that boundary southerly and the south boundary of that two thousand acres easterly to Wallis Creek thence again on the east by Wallis Creek and Mulbring Creek to the source of the latter in the Sugar  
 40 Loaf Range and thence again on the south by that range and the range westerly to Broken-back Mountain on the west by a line north-easterly to the western source of Black Creek thence on the west by Black Creek downwards to the river Hunter by that river to the south-eastern corner of Gaggin's two thousand acres grant on that river in the county of Durham thence by the eastern boundary of that land  
 45 bearing north and a line in continuation thereof bearing north to the range dividing the waters of Glendon Brook from those of Lamb's Valley Creek and the Paterson River thence by that range northerly and the Mount Royal Range northerly to the range at the head of the Paterson River on the north by that range easterly on the east by the range dividing the waters of the Allyn and Paterson Rivers from  
 50 those of the Williams River southerly to the south boundary of Hugh Torrens' two thousand acres thence again on the south by that boundary to its south-west corner by a line thence to the south-eastern corner of W. Dunn's one thousand three hundred acres by the south boundary of that land to the Paterson River thence by that river downwards to where the road from the Maitland and Paterson Roads to Lang's Mill meets that  
 55 river thence by that road and the Maitland and Paterson Road southerly to the north boundary of J. Brown's two thousand and thirty acres called "Bulwarra" by that boundary easterly to the river Hunter and thence by that river to the point of commencement.

## 36. ILLAWARRA.

Embracing a north-eastern portion of the county of Camden and a south-eastern portion of the county of Cumberland and bounded on the north by a line south-westerly from the Coal Cliff to the confluence of the Cataract Creek with the Cataract River and by that river downwards to the confluence of Wallandoola Creek on the west by that creek upwards to a point due north of the confluence of Cordeaux River and Cordeaux  
 65 Creek thence by a line south to that confluence thence by a line southerly to Mount Murray in the Illawarra Range and by that range southerly to the source of the Macquarie Rivulet on the south by that rivulet to the Illawarra Lake and by that lake to the sea and on the east by the sea to the Coal Cliff aforesaid.



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## 37. INVERELL.

Embracing part of the pastoral district of New England and Gwydir and bounded on the east from the confluence of the Glen or Beardy River with the Dumaresq River by the western watershed of the Glen or Beardy River south-easterly and the northern watershed of the Severn River easterly to a point due north from the north-west corner of H. Gordon's 160 acres at Strathbogie thence by a line south to that corner and by the west boundary of that land to the Severn River and thence by a line bearing south to the eastern watershed of Arrawatta Creek thence by the range dividing the waters falling to that creek and King's Plain Creek Swan Brook and the Macintyre River from those falling to Cameron's Creek Wellingrove Creek and the Beardy Waters tributaries of the Severn River southerly to the northern watershed of Clark's Creek on the south by the northern watershed of Clark's Creek and Tienga or New Valley Creek westerly to the confluence of Tienga Creek to the Bundarra or Gwydir River on the west by that river downwards to the confluence of Auburn Vale or Cope's Creek and thence by the western watershed of that creek northerly and the eastern watershed of Myall Creek a tributary of the Gwydir River northerly to the range dividing the Macintyre and Gwydir Rivers thence by that range and the western boundaries of the Bannockburn and Redbank Runs northerly to the junction of Redbank Creek with the Macintyre River thence by that river northerly to the confluence of Bill's Gully and thence by a line north-easterly to the junction of Myall Creek with the river Severn and thence by a line north-easterly to the Dumaresq River at the boundary dividing Goonian and Bonshaw Runs and thence on the north by the Dumaresq River south-easterly to the point of commencement.

## 38. KIAMA.

Embracing an eastern portion of the county of Camden and bounded on the north by the Illawarra Lake and the Macquarie Rivulet to its source on the west by the Illawarra Range and the middle source of the Kangaroo River to a point due west from the head of the Crooked River on the south by a line from that point to the head of the Crooked River and by that river to the sea and on the east by the sea to the Illawarra Lake aforesaid.

## 39. LIVERPOOL PLAINS.

Embracing the eastern portion of the pastoral district of Liverpool Plains bounded on the north by part of the northern boundary of the pastoral district of Liverpool Plains being the Nandewar Range which divides the waters of the Namoi River from those of the Gwydir River on the west by a line south-westerly from that range passing between the heads of Goor and Maule's Creeks to the Namoi River about two miles above Dr. Milner's house at the Broadwater and thence by a line southerly passing between the heads of Brigalow and Turrabeile Creeks to the Warrabangle Range on the south by that range and the Liverpool Range easterly to the eastern boundary of the pastoral district of Liverpool Plains and on the east by that boundary being the western extreme of the table land of New England to the Nandewar Range dividing the waters of the Namoi and Gwydir Rivers aforesaid.

## 40. EAST MACQUARIE.

Embracing the south-western portion of the county of Roxburgh and a north-western portion of the county of Westmoreland and bounded on the north from the confluence of Williwa Creek with the Turon River by that river downward to the confluence of Round Swamp Creek and thence by the range forming the western watershed of that creek the range forming the southern watershed of Warragunnia Creek and a spur range to Cunningham's Creek opposite to the confluence of the tributary falling into it from Mount Corcalgong by Cunningham's Creek and the Turon River to its confluence with the Macquarie thence on the west by the Macquarie River upward to the confluence of Campbell's River and by that river upward on the south by Campbell's River to its source in the Great Dividing Range thence on the east by the Fish River Creek to the Fish River and by the Fish River to the confluence of Solitary Creek thence by Solitary Creek to Rydal where the Bathurst Road crosses that creek by that road westerly to the Great Dividing Range by that range northerly to the source of Williwa Creek and by that creek to its confluence with the Turon River aforesaid.

## 41. WEST MACQUARIE.

Embracing the eastern portion of the county of Bathurst and the north-eastern portion of the county of Georgiana and bounded on the east and north by Campbell's River from its source in the great Dividing Range to its confluence with the Macquarie River and by that river downward to the confluence of Lewis Ponds Creek thence on the west by the range forming the eastern watershed of Lewis Ponds Creek to the range dividing the waters of the Macquarie and Belubula Rivers and by that range southerly to the range dividing the waters of the Abercrombie and Macquarie Rivers and on the south by that range easterly to the Great Dividing Range at the source of Campbell's River aforesaid But excluding therefrom the Electoral District of Bathurst.



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## 42. THE MACLEAY.

Embracing part of the pastoral district of Macleay and part of the county of Macquarie and bounded on the north by the range forming the southern watershed of the Clarence River and a line bearing east to the sea near the Solitary Islands on the east by the sea southerly to Crescent Head thence on the south by a line bearing north-west to the range dividing the waters of the Macleay and Hastings Rivers by that range westerly to Mount Kippara and thence by a line south-westerly to Mount Sea View and thence on the west by a line northerly to Mount Werrikimbe and a line north thence north by compass to the range forming the southern watershed of the Clarence River aforesaid.

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## 43. MAITLAND WEST.

County of Northumberland at West Maitland bounded on the west from Hunter's River by the boundary dividing H. D. Owen's one thousand one hundred acres from Sir J. Jamieson's three hundred acres southerly and the west boundary of H. Brown's two thousand and thirty acres called Bulwarra by that boundary easterly to the River Hunter by that river



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river upwards to the boundary line between J. Griffiths' two hundred acres and J. Close's two thousand and fifty acres by the west and south boundaries of Close's two thousand and fifty acres southerly and easterly and by the west boundaries of Close's five hundred and sixty acres and Joseph Moore's two thousand five hundred and sixty acres southerly to the road from Maitland to Raymond Terrace on the south

## 69. TAMBAROORA AND HILL END.

Embracing a south-eastern portion of the county of Wellington and bounded on the north from a tributary of Cunningham's Creek which rises south of the Cudgegong Creek by the range dividing the waters of the Cudgegong and Macquarie Rivers which forms the southern watershed of the Meroo Creek and the range forming the northern watershed of the Pyramul River westerly to a point opposite to the confluence of Currugurra Creek with the Macquarie River on the west by the Macquarie River upwards to the Turon River on the south by the Turon River upwards to the confluence of Cunningham's Creek and on the east by that creek and the aforesaid tributary thereof upwards to the range dividing the waters of the Cudgegong and Macquarie Rivers aforesaid.

## 70. TENTERFIELD.

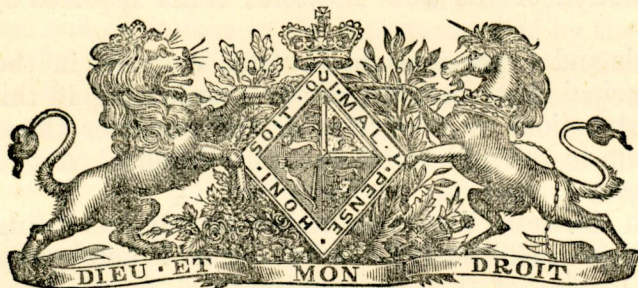

An Act to make better provision for the Representation of the People in the Legislative Assembly.

WHEREAS it is expedient that better provision should be made for the Representation of the People in the Legislative Assembly by sub-dividing the Colony into an increased number of Electoral Districts and by establishing a system of Registration of Voters and also to amend the "Electoral Act of 1858" in certain respects Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

10 1. This Act shall be read with and as forming part of the "Electoral Act of 1858" hereinafter termed the "Principal Act" which together with and as amended by this Act may be cited as the "Electoral Acts 1858—1874" And this Act when specifically meant or referred to may be cited as the "Electoral Act Amendment Act of 15 1874."

12. No person shall be entitled to vote at any election in any Electoral District unless his name shall be on the Electoral Roll of such district in force for the time being and he be also the holder of a Certificate of Registration (hereinafter termed an “Elector’s Right”) issued to him in pursuance of the provisions of this Act And such Elector’s Right shall during the time such person’s name shall be on such Electoral Roll so in force as aforesaid be conclusive evidence of the right of such person to vote unless he be disqualified or incapacitated for some cause mentioned in the Principal Act.

Who entitled to vote at elections.

13. The Collector of every Police District shall transmit a copy of the alphabetical list of persons qualified to vote for the election of Members of the Assembly required by law to be made by him between the first and the twenty-eighth day of June in each year to the Government Printer who shall cause the same to be printed and shall forward a copy thereof to the said Collector who shall forthwith compare it with the list in his possession and make such corrections therein as may be necessary in order that the same shall correspond accurately with the said list And the said Collector after having so examined such printed copy and made such corrections therein (if any) as may be necessary shall sign and deliver the same to the Clerk of Petty Sessions of the Police District for which such Collector is appointed and the copy so signed and delivered shall be the copy to be dealt with by such Clerk of Petty Sessions according to the provisions of the seventeenth section of the Principal Act as amended by this Act And all such copies thereof as may be required by the Clerk of Petty Sessions for sale or publication as required by the said seventeenth section shall be supplied by the Government Printer Provided always that in case the said printed copy shall not be forwarded by the Government Printer as aforesaid to the said Collector or shall not reach him in due time as hereinbefore provided the said Collector shall make out a copy of the list in his possession and deliver such copy to the Clerk of Petty Sessions for the purposes of the said Principal Act.

Collectors to send Lists to Government Printer to be printed.



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13. Every person not entitled as aforesaid but claiming a right to vote at any election of a Member or Members to serve in the Assembly in and for any Electoral District shall on some day before the seventh day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four and before the same day in each succeeding year deliver in person or transmit by post or otherwise notice in writing thereof in the form or to the effect in the second Schedule hereto to the Clerk of Petty Sessions of the Police District within which the qualification of the person so claiming title to vote in and for such Electoral District arises or is situate which notice shall be accompanied by a solemn declaration written thereon or attached thereto in the form or to the effect in the said second Schedule.

Procedure by persons claiming right to vote.

14. Every such Clerk of Petty Sessions shall before the thirty-first day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four transmit a copy of the list of persons within his Police District so claiming to vote and before the like day in each succeeding year shall transmit a copy of the list of persons within such Police District qualified or claiming to vote constructed and arranged on the basis and according to the form of the last Electoral Roll numbered in ascending arithmetical series commencing from number one and arranged in alphabetical order and according to the form and distribution shewn in the third Schedule hereto to the Government Printer to be dealt with by him as hereinafter mentioned And it shall be the duty of every such Clerk of Petty Sessions to enter the names of all persons so claiming to vote in a Register of Claims to be kept by him for that purpose in alphabetical order (according to the initial letter of the claimants' names) And he shall file the notices mentioned in the thirteenth section hereof received by him in each year and preserve them until the termination of the revision of the Lists in each year Provided that whenever any Police District forms portions of two or more Electoral Districts the Clerks of Petty Sessions shall make separate Lists for each such portion.

Clerk of Petty Sessions to send Lists to Government Printer.

15. Where the boundaries of any Electoral District described in Schedule A to the "Electoral Act of 1858" remain unaltered by this Act the Clerk of Petty Sessions of every Police District shall before the thirty-first day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four transmit to the Government Printer the Lists of persons claiming to vote in respect of such Electoral District from whom he shall have received notices in terms of the thirteenth section hereof together with a copy of the Electoral Roll in force for such last-mentioned year And such Lists shall be arranged by every such Clerk of Petty Sessions before transmission in the manner prescribed by the next preceding section hereof.

The Government Printer upon receipt by him of such Lists or of such Lists and Rolls as the case may be shall thereupon cause the same to be printed according to the form numbering and distribution shewn in the third Schedule hereto and shall before the thirty-first day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four and before the like day in each succeeding year transmit a copy thereof to each such Clerk of Petty Sessions who shall forthwith compare it with the List in their possession and make such corrections therein as may be necessary in order that the same shall correspond accurately with the said List And such Clerk of Petty Sessions after having so examined such printed copy and made such corrections therein (if any) as may be necessary shall sign the same and the copy so signed shall be the copy to be dealt with by such Clerk of Petty Sessions according to the provisions of the Principal Act as amended by this Act And every such Clerk of Petty Sessions shall deliver a copy of such List to any person requiring the same on payment of a reasonable price for each copy and shall likewise cause

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copies of the Lists of their respective Police Districts to be fixed on the respective Court-houses thereof and in such other public place as may by the Court of Petty Sessions be directed for the period of fourteen days ending on the fifteenth day of November in each year And  
 5 all such copies as may be required by the Clerks of Petty Sessions for such sale or publication shall be supplied by the Government Printer Provided always that in case the said printed copy shall not be forwarded by the Government Printer as aforesaid to the said Clerk of Petty Sessions or shall not reach him in due time as hereinbefore  
 10 provided the copy of the List in his possession shall suffice for the purposes of the said Principal Act and of this Act.

17. The Lists so to be exhibited shall be the Lists for the purpose of any claims or objections as mentioned in the twenty-first section of the principal Act Provided that notices thereof as therein  
 15 mentioned shall be given or transmitted as therein required on or before the seventh day of November in each year And the exhibition of such claims and objections in the form prescribed by the said section shall be made by Clerks of Petty Sessions and copies thereof be open to perusal as therein required during the seven days ending on the  
 20 fifteenth day of November in each year.

18. For the purposes of the revision of the said Lists the days and times prescribed in the twenty-second and twenty-fifth sections of the Principal Act are hereby extended so as to embrace in each case the period between the fifteenth and twenty-fifth days of November in  
 25 each year.

19. Within twenty-four hours after the revision of the said Lists in every year the Clerks of Petty Sessions shall transmit the Lists so revised to the Government Printer who shall cause a general alphabetical Roll of the Electors of every Electoral District numbered in  
 30 regular ascending arithmetical series commencing from number one and arranged and distributed according to the form in the third Schedule hereto to be printed with as little delay as possible from the Lists so transmitted to him And shall on or before the thirty-first day of December in each year cause to be transmitted by post such Roll to the Returning  
 35 Officer of every Electoral District to which it appertains And such general Roll shall be the Roll of Electors of such district for the purposes of this Act for the period between the thirty-first day of December in the year in which such Roll shall have been made and the thirty-first day of December inclusive in the succeeding year Provided that if in  
 40 any year the Roll for any Electoral District shall not be regularly made out or shall not be perfected the Roll for the preceding year or the last perfect Roll shall wholly or in part as the case may require be used as the Roll for such first-mentioned year And the Returning Officer in every Electoral District shall deliver a copy of the Roll for such district  
 45 to all persons applying for the same on payment of a reasonable price for each copy.

20. The Colonial Secretary shall from time to time cause to be printed on suitable paper certificates with butts or counterfoils (hereinafter called butts) in the form contained in the fourth Schedule hereto  
 50 and shall from time to time cause a sufficient number of the said Certificates to be numbered in a regularly ascending arithmetical series commencing with number one and such numbering shall be effected by printing or stamping the number in red ink in the body and also in the butt of each Certificate and such Certificates shall upon  
 55 issue as hereinafter provided be called "Electors' Rights."

21. The Colonial Secretary shall from time to time cause the certificates so printed and numbered as aforesaid to be bound together in books containing not less than one hundred nor more than two hundred in each book and also cause a sufficient number of Certificates

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unnumbered to be bound together in separate books containing the like quantity and shall from time to time as shall be needful cause to be transmitted to each Clerk of Petty Sessions so many books of certificates numbered as aforesaid and also so many without any number as may be required by such Clerk of Petty Sessions for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

22. Any person entitled under this Act to have an Elector's Right issued to him for any Electoral District who shall apply in person to the Clerk of Petty Sessions or to his deputy charged with the duty of issuing the same for such district and who shall by his answers to the questions put to him (or other evidence if required) as herein provided establish his right to exercise the vote which he claims and shall in the presence of the said Clerk of Petty Sessions or deputy sign his name in a book to be kept for the purpose and also severally in the body and the butt of the Electors' Right to be issued to him and pay to the said Clerk of Petty Sessions or other person as aforesaid the sum of                      shall be entitled to receive from the said Clerk of Petty Sessions or deputy a numbered Certificate purporting to entitle him to vote in and for such district in elections of Members to serve in the Legislative Assembly and stating the several particulars required to be contained in such form and such Clerk of Petty Sessions or deputy shall at the time of issuing the same enter in the butt thereof the several particulars by this Act required to be stated in the Elector's Right Provided that in every instance where an elector is by this Act required to sign his name he may if unable to write make his mark in the presence of a witness in lieu of his signature.

23. The Clerk of Petty Sessions or Deputy before issuing any Elector's Right under the preceding provisions shall put to the person applying for the same the following questions—

- (1.) Are you the same person whose name appears as number                      in the Roll in force for this Electoral District?
- (2.) Have you received an Elector's Right enabling you to vote in this Electoral District?

And any person who shall wilfully and knowingly make a false declaration in answer to any of the questions so put to him by such Clerk of Petty Sessions or Deputy shall upon summary conviction before any two Justices of such offence be imprisoned for any time not exceeding six months Provided that if the said Clerk of Petty Sessions or Deputy shall not be satisfied of the identity of the person applying to him with the person on the Roll in whose name he claims an Elector's Right such Clerk of Petty Sessions or Deputy shall be at liberty to withhold such Elector's Right until satisfactory evidence of such identity shall be produced to him which evidence he shall be at liberty to take on oath or by solemn declaration in writing And any person knowingly or wilfully giving false evidence or making a false answer to any question put to him by such Clerk of Petty Sessions or Deputy shall be liable upon summary conviction before any two Justices to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding six calendar months.

24. No person shall be entitled to have issued to him more than one Elector's Right purporting to entitle him to vote in the same Electoral District.

25. When from the extent of any Electoral District or the distance of parts thereof from any Court of Petty Sessions it shall appear to the Colonial Secretary impracticable for electors to repair in person for the purpose of obtaining their Electors' Rights to a Clerk of Petty

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Petty Sessions it shall be lawful for the Colonial Secretary to order any Clerk of Petty Sessions to intrust the issuing of such Electors' Rights to any approved person as his deputy and such deputy shall be authorized under the direction of the Colonial Secretary to visit such distant parts and to issue Electors' Rights on the same proof and in the same manner as such Clerk of Petty Sessions is authorized to issue the same But this provision shall not extend to the issuing of substituted Electors' Rights hereinafter mentioned which shall only be issued by a Clerk of Petty Sessions.

- 10 26. If any Elector's Right be lost or so torn or defaced as to be in any essential part illegible the holder thereof if he be still qualified to vote may in lieu of such lost torn or defaced Elector's Right obtain a substituted Elector's Right of the like purport in manner following that is to say—If he shall in person apply to the Clerk  
15 of Petty Sessions having charge of the Electoral Roll for the Electoral District for which such lost torn or defaced right was issued and shall by his answers to the questions put to him as hereinafter required and on production to him of the butt of the said right by such Clerk show his title to have a substituted right issued to him and shall  
20 sign his name or (when the original elector's right shall have been signed with a mark) make his mark in the presence of such Clerk in a book to be kept by such Clerk for that purpose and also in the body and in the butt of the Elector's Right to be substituted before the issuing thereof and shall pay to such Clerk the sum of  
25 such Clerk shall upon delivery to him (if such Electoral Right be only torn or defaced) of the same or the remnant thereof after ascertaining the number of the right so lost torn or defaced enter the said number in the body and in the butt of an unnumbered Certificate and shall fill up sign and issue to the applicant such substituted  
30 Elector's Right in like manner and form in all respects as hereinbefore provided with regard to an original Elector's Right and shall write across the face of such substituted Elector's Right and across the butt thereof the word "substituted."

Such Clerk of Petty Sessions before issuing any substituted Elector's Right under the last preceding section shall put to any person applying for the same the following questions in addition to the questions hereinbefore required to be put to any applicant for an original Elector's Right that is to say—

- 40 (If the Elector's Right be stated to be lost) Have you made diligent search for the original Elector's Right in respect of the loss of which you now claim a substituted one and is the same to the best of your belief wholly lost?

- 45 (If the Elector's Right be stated to be defaced or torn) Is the Elector's Right now produced by you the original one in respect of which you now claim or so much as remains thereof?

- (In cases where the original Elector's Right shall have been signed otherwise than with a mark) Are you the person described as in the butt now shown to you and is the signature thereon your signature?

- 50 (In all cases) Are you still possessed of the qualification in respect of which you claimed your original Elector's Right?

- And any person who shall wilfully or knowingly make a false answer to any question put under this section shall upon conviction in a summary way before any two Justices of such offence be liable to  
55 imprisonment for any term not exceeding six calendar months.

28. The Clerk of Petty Sessions shall upon issuing any substituted Elector's Right as aforesaid cancel the butt of the original Elector's Right on which the same number appears by writing across the same the words "new Elector's Right issued" and shall affix thereto his  
60 signature and the date of such cancellation.

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29. No transfer delivery pledge sale or gift of or lien on an Elector's Right shall be valid against the person to whom the same was issued and any Justice on complaint made by any such person that any other person detains or has in his possession any such Elector's Right and on proof of refusal to deliver up such Elector's Right to the person to whom it was issued may order the same to be delivered up to the complainant and every person who shall in defiance of the Justice's order detain such Elector's Right shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

30. The mode of tendering votes at elections and procedure incident thereto hereinafter described shall be substituted for those specified in the forty-second section of the Principal Act—

(1.) Every person tendering his vote shall do so in manner following (that is to say)—He shall state to the Returning or Presiding Officer his christian names and surname and such particulars required by this Act to be expressed in the Electoral Roll as the said Returning or Presiding Officer may require for the purpose of ascertaining and verifying upon the Roll the name intended by such person and shall exhibit to the Returning or Presiding Officer the Elector's Right which shall purport to entitle him to exercise such right of voting and shall thereupon demand a ballot-paper :

The Returning or Presiding Officer may if he think fit and shall if required so to do by any scrutineer require any person tendering his vote before he shall receive a ballot-paper to sign his name or (if his Elector's Right shall appear to be signed with a mark) make his mark in a book to be kept for that purpose and the Returning or Presiding Officer shall compare such signature with the signature purporting to be that of the holder of such Elector's Right and appearing thereon as hereinbefore provided :

When any person shall have tendered his vote at any polling-place in manner hereinbefore required the Returning or Presiding Officer shall ascertain that the name given by such person is upon the Elector's Right (if any) exhibited by him and also upon the Electoral Roll of the district and shall compare such Elector's Right with such name upon the Roll and the particulars stated against the same so as by inspection to satisfy himself of the identity of the person to whom such Elector's Right shall have been issued with the person so named on the roll :

(4.) Each elector having tendered his vote in manner hereinbefore provided and having previously satisfied the Returning or Presiding Officer that he is entitled to vote at such election and demanded a ballot-paper shall then receive from the Presiding Officer or Poll Clerk one of the ballot-papers initialled by the Presiding Officer at the time of the delivery of which ballot paper to any elector the Presiding Officer or Poll Clerk shall mark the Elector's Right produced by him with his (the Presiding Officer's) initials and with the date expressed in the following figures (that is to say) the number of the day of the month the number of the month in the year and the number of the year in the century of our Lord and return the same to such person and such mark shall be prima facie evidence of the identity of such elector with the person producing such Elector's Right and of the fact of his having voted at such election and such Presiding Officer or Poll Clerk shall also upon a certified copy of the Electoral Roll make a mark against the name of such elector which mark shall be prima facie

31. No inquiry shall be permitted at the time of polling as to

 the Presiding Officer shall if he think fit or if required by any candi-  
 date or scrutineer put to any elector before he shall have voted and not  
 afterwards the following questions or any of them but no other:—

(1.) Was the Elector's Right now produced by you issued to you?  
 10 (2.) Are you the same person whose name appears as (A.B. No. )  
 in the Roll in force for this Electoral District and in the  
 Elector's Right now produced by you?

(3.) Have you already voted either here or elsewhere at the  
 present election for this Electoral District?

32. If at any polling-booth any ballot-paper shall have been  
 15 delivered to any person having tendered his vote and if any other  
 person shall afterwards tender his vote at such booth as of the same  
 person in whose name such first-mentioned person shall have received  
 such ballot-paper the Returning or Presiding Officer shall put to  
 20 the person so secondly tendering the prescribed questions and also  
 shall require him to sign his name in the book and in the manner  
 aforesaid and such person shall and may be dealt with in all respects  
 in like manner as any other person having tendered his vote but the  
 ballot-paper of such person shall not be deposited in the ballot-box  
 25 or allowed by the Returning or Presiding Officer and shall be set aside  
 by him for separate custody and the Elector's Right or pretended  
 Elector's Right produced by such person shall be retained by such  
 Returning or Presiding Officer and impounded.

33. If any person shall have tendered his vote as the holder of  
 30 an Elector's Right and his writing in the book (if he shall have signed  
 the same) hereinbefore mentioned of the name in which he shall  
 demand to vote shall not in the opinion of the Returning or Presiding  
 Officer be of the same handwriting as the signature appearing upon  
 the Elector's Right when the same is signed otherwise than with a  
 35 mark produced by him and purporting to be the signature of the  
 holder thereof the Returning or Presiding Officer shall set aside for  
 separate custody as in the next preceding section mentioned the ballot-  
 paper of such person and shall not allow the same and shall impound  
 the Elector's Right or pretended Elector's Right of such person.

34. If any person without the authority of the Colonial  
 40 Secretary and without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall be upon  
 the person charged) shall print supply issue or have in his possession  
 any Certificate or document in the form or resembling or apparently  
 intended to resemble the form set forth in the fourth Schedule hereto  
 45 or shall forge or utter knowing the same to be forged any such Certifi-  
 cate or Elector's Right he shall on conviction of any such offence incur  
 the penalty assigned by the sixty-fourth section of the Principal Act to  
 the offence of personation.

14. In every Electoral District every Clerk of Petty Sessions  
 50 shall on or before the twelfth day of October in each year deliver  
 the lists revised as required by the Principal Act to the Returning  
 Officer of the Electoral District to which the same belong And  
 such Returning Officer after having received the list or lists of the  
 electors for the whole of such Electoral District shall forthwith transmit  
 55 such list or lists or copies thereof to the Government Printer to be  
 compiled by him in the form of a general alphabetical roll of the Electors

 order Provided that when any Electoral District shall comprise more

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- of the electors of each such Police District or portion of a Police District shall be placed together in alphabetical order according to the form and arrangement shewn in the Second Schedule hereto so as to form a distinct division within the same roll and each such division shall be designated by the name of the Police District to which it belongs and the numbering in regular arithmetical order hereinbefore prescribed shall be preserved throughout such roll And if in any year the roll for any Electoral District shall not be made out or dealt with as required by law or shall not be perfected the last duly completed roll shall wholly or in part as the case may require be used as the roll for that year And such electoral roll so compiled shall be the roll of electors for each Electoral District for the period intervening between the twelfth day of October next ensuing and the thirty-first day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five and thereafter in every subsequent year such roll shall be the roll of electors as aforesaid from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December both inclusive And every such roll shall during any such period as aforesaid be conclusive evidence of the title to vote of each elector therein named unless he be disqualified or incapacitated by any of the causes mentioned in the Principal Act.
- 15- 35. All Writs for General Elections to the Assembly shall be issued within two clear days after the publication in the *Gazette* of the Proclamation dissolving Parliament. Writs for General Elections when to be issued.
- 16- 36. Such Writs shall in every case be made returnable on a day not later than the thirty-fifth clear day after the date of the issue thereof. When returnable.
- 17- 37. The day to be fixed for the meeting of Parliament after the return of such Writs shall not be later than the seventh clear day after the date on which such Writs shall have been made returnable as aforesaid. When Parliament to meet after return of Writs.
18. At every future nomination of persons to serve in the Assembly it shall be necessary to the validity of such nomination that each candidate shall be proposed and seconded by persons who are qualified to vote at such election. Candidate to be proposed and seconded by duly qualified electors.
- 19- 38. At every nomination of a candidate for any Electoral District it shall be necessary to the validity of such nomination that such candidate shall be proposed by a person qualified to vote for such Electoral District and be seconded by another person qualified in like manner. Candidate to be proposed and seconded by qualified electors.
- 20- 39. No person shall be capable of being elected a Member of the Legislative Assembly who shall have taken the benefit of any Act for the relief of insolvent debtors until he shall have obtained a certificate of discharge under the said Act or until his estate shall have been duly released from sequestration. Uncertificated insolvent incapable of being elected.
- 20- 40. So much of the seventy-fifth section of the Principal Act as prescribes the period of eight weeks after the return of writs within which petitions embodying any of the causes of complaint mentioned in the said section shall be presented to the Governor or Speaker shall be and the same is hereby repealed And from and after the date of the passing of this Act the period within which every such petition shall be so presented shall be limited to twenty-one clear days after the day of the return of the writ to which such petition shall relate And no writ for a new election for a seat vacated by acceptance of office under the nineteenth section of the Act eighteenth and nineteenth Victoria chapter fifty-four shall be issued until after the expiration of twenty-one days from the date of the return of the writ certifying the election of the Member whose seat had so become vacant as aforesaid.  with the Crookwell River by the Crookwell River downwards to the junction of the  
 Lachlan River thence on the west by that river upwards to the junction of Grabben  
 15 Gullen Creek thence on the south by the southern watershed of that creek easterly and  
 a line east to the south-west corner of J. Tully's conditional purchase portion one parish  
 of Lampton county of King thence by the south boundary of that portion easterly to its  
 south-east corner and thence by a line south and the west boundaries of portions twenty-

 westerly and a line west to its intersection with the southerly prolongation of the  
 eastern boundary of portion one hundred and forty of that parish thence by that pro-  
 longation and that boundary northerly to the north-east corner of that portion thence  
 40 the north boundaries of portions one hundred and forty aforesaid one hundred and eleven  
 six seven nineteen twenty twenty-one thirty thirty-one fifty-three to the north-west  
 corner of the latter portion thence the western boundaries of portions fifty-three and fifty-

 southern and western boundaries of portion two hundred and twenty-two of that parish  
 55 southerly westerly and northerly and the southern and western boundaries of portion  
 two hundred and twenty three westerly and northerly to the range dividing Eight-mile  
 Creek from Four-mile Creek thence by the range dividing those creeks southerly and the  
 range forming the northern watershed of Bungambrawatha Creek and Splitter's Creek  
 south-westerly and westerly to Corner Hill at the western boundary of the county of  
 60 Goulburn thence on the west by part of the western boundary of that county southerly  
 to the Murray River and thence on the south and again on the east by that river upwards  
 to the point of commencement.



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## 3. ARMIDALE.

Embracing part of the county of Sandon Bounded on the east from the south-eastern corner of P. Charlton's conditional purchase of two hundred acres on Tilbuster Ponds portion ten parish of Donald by Tilbuster Ponds downwards to the south-eastern corner of portion five hundred and twenty-six parish of Armidale thence by the south boundary of that portion and its continuation to the eastern boundary of portion four hundred and thirty-nine of that parish thence by the eastern boundary of that portion and portions four hundred and thirty-eight four hundred and twenty-eight four hundred and twenty-seven four hundred and twenty-four four hundred and twenty-three and four hundred and twenty-two of that parish and by the eastern boundaries of H.
