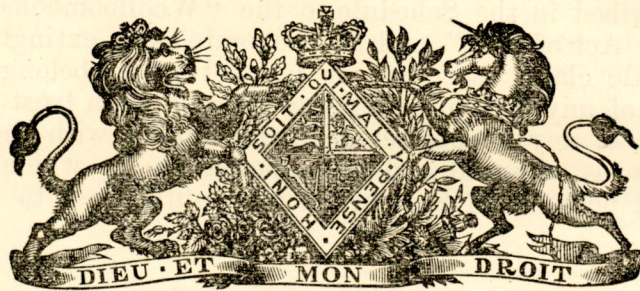

An Act to authorize certain grants of Land to be made by way of compensation for losses of Water-frontage in Woolloomooloo Bay.

**W**HEREAS in pursuance of the provisions contained in the <sup>Preamble.</sup> "Woolloomooloo Bay Land Reclamation Act of 1862" the land described in the Schedule to the said Act has been reclaimed from the waters of Port Jackson And whereas in consequence of such reclamation certain owners of land severed from immediate contact with the said waters became entitled to compensation as provided by the said Act And whereas some of such owners as aforesaid or persons claiming through or in trust for such owners have severally agreed to accept subject to the approval of Parliament certain portions of land in the said Bay formerly lying below high-water-mark and alleged to have been severally reclaimed from such waters by such owners as aforesaid as and in full satisfaction for and extinction of all such rights to compensation and all other claims whatsoever of them the said owners or such persons as aforesaid And whereas it is necessary that the said several agreements should be ratified by Parliament Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council to grant to the several persons mentioned in the second column of the Schedule to this Act upon the establishment by

such persons of their respective titles to the land in respect of which the portions of land hereinafter mentioned are authorized to be granted by way of compensation for losses of water-frontage the portion or portions of land set against their respective names in the

5 said Schedule according to the respective areas and descriptions as set forth in the third and fourth columns thereof And each such grant of any of the said portions of land to any such persons or corporation shall be in full satisfaction and compensation for any losses whatsoever sustained by such persons whether in their own right or

10 derivatively by reason of the reclamation of the land or any portion thereof described in the Schedule to the "Woolloomooloo Bay Land Reclamation Act of 1862" and shall operate as an extinguishment of any right title claim easement or interest of or belonging to the owners and of any persons claiming through or in trust for them or

15 any of them of any land so severed from contact with the waters of Port Jackson as aforesaid and as compensation for which severances the aforesaid portions of land are hereby authorized to be granted respectively.

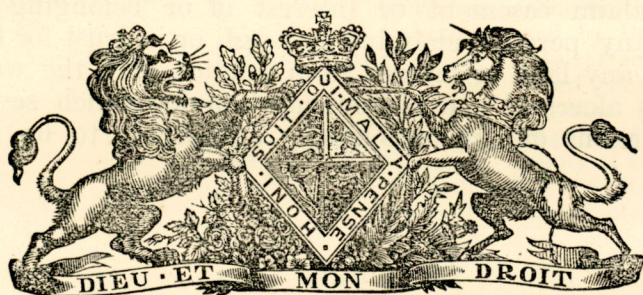
