This Public Bill originated in the Legislative Assembly, and, having this day passed, is now ready for presentation to the Legislative Council for its concurrence.

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain Sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the Year 1875 and for the Year 1874 and previous Years.

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects Preamble. the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled have granted to Your Majesty the several sums hereinafter mentioned for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five and for supplementing the Grants made by the late Parliament in its Third Session for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four and previous years.
