This Public Bill originated in the Legislative Assembly, and, having this day passed, is now ready for presentation to the Legislative Council for its concurrence.

W HEREAS certain Crown Lands described in the Schedule hereto Preamble.

annexed have been duly dedicated for various purposes and it is expedient that such dedications should be cancelled and the said lands be resumed by the Crown Be it therefore enacted by the 5 Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The several parcels of land specified in the Schedule hereto Land specified in 10 annexed shall on the passing of this Act be resumed by and be revested Schedule to be in Her Majesty her heirs and successors as fully to all intents and purposes as if no such dedication thereof had been made.
