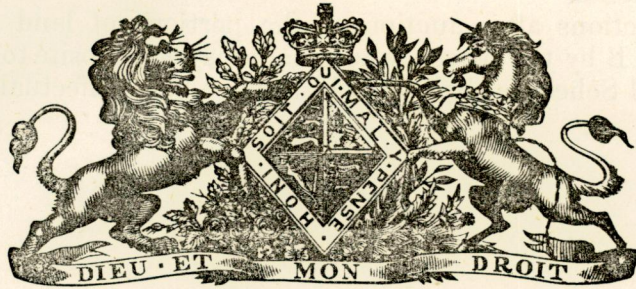

An Act to legalize certain Conditional and other Purchases.

WHEREAS the persons whose names are hereafter mentioned in ^{Preamble.} Schedule A have made Conditional Purchases under the "Crown Lands Alienation Act of 1861" of certain portions of Crown Lands and the said conditional purchases have been subsequently found to be
5 illegal for the reasons specified in connexion with each purchase respectively in the said Schedule And whereas such persons have for some considerable period resided upon and have improved the said lands And whereas the person whose name is mentioned in Schedule
10 B selected after auction and paid the price of certain Crown Lands which for the reason specified in the said Schedule could not be legally so selected And whereas it is just and expedient to sell to the persons whose names are mentioned in the said Schedule A the portions of land set opposite to their respective names at an appraised value and to legalize and declare valid the conditional purchases and selections after
15 auction specified in the said Schedules respectively B Be it therefore enacted

Legalization of certain Conditional and other Purchases.

Certain conditional purchases to be held to be valid.

10 1. The Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may sell and grant the several portions of land mentioned in Schedule A hereto annexed to the respective persons whose names are set opposite to such portions of lands in the said Schedule without competition in fee simple at a price to be fixed by appraisement in accordance with the provisions of the "Crown Lands Alienation Act of 1861" such price not being less than eight pounds an acre for town lands and one pound an acre for other lands but such appraisement shall not include any value for improvements.

The sale of certain Crown Lands authorized.

20 2. The selections after auction of the portions of land mentioned in Schedule B by the person whose name is set opposite to such portions in the said Schedule shall be held to have been effectual and valid in law.

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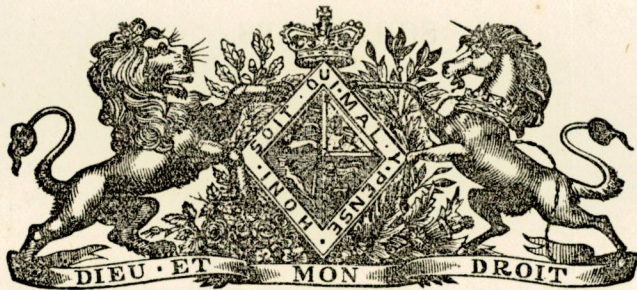
