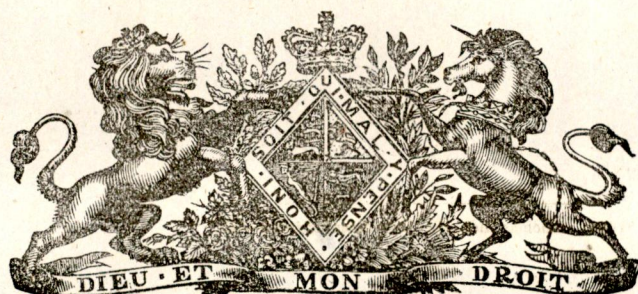

An Act to abolish a certain Lane proclaimed as Susan-lane near the waters of Woolloomooloo Bay in the City of Sydney and dedicate to the public in lieu thereof and in exchange therefor a new street from Susan-lane on the Tusculum Estate to Forbes-street in the said City.

WHEREAS it is expedient to abolish a certain lane proclaimed as Susan-lane leading from Forbes-street in the City of Sydney to Dowling-street and to abolish all rights-of-way over the same and to create and dedicate to the public in perpetuity in lieu of and in exchange for the said rights-of-way so to be abolished as aforesaid a public street of the uniform width of twenty feet in extension of and leading from Susan-lane on the Tusculum Estate to Forbes-street in the said City Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. From and after the passing of this Act the lane proclaimed as Susan-lane in the City of Sydney leading from Forbes-street to Dowling-street and passing between the properties of Francis Callaghan Thomas Buckland James Ireland Abel Pring and Alexander Lowe and all rights-of-way in over or appurtenant to the same respectively shall be and are hereby abolished and extinguished.

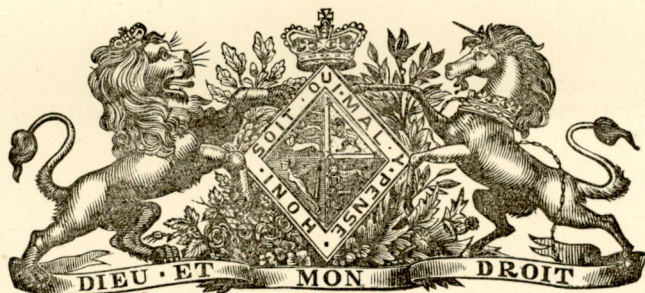

2. From and after the passing of this Act a street of the uniform width of twenty feet in extension of and leading from Susan-lane as now formed on the Tusculum Estate to Forbes-street aforesaid through the lands of Thomas Buckland and Francis Callaghan and commencing
5 at a point on the south side of Susan-lane at its western termination and bounded on the south by a line bearing west fifty-eight minutes south to Forbes-street on the west by Forbes-street twenty feet north-erly on the north by a line bearing east fifty-eight minutes north to the western termination of Susan-lane and on the east by the western
10 boundary of Susan-lane to the point of commencement shall be and the same is hereby created and dedicated to the public as a public thoroughfare in perpetuity.
