

An Act to amend the "Volunteer Force Regulation Act of 1867."

WHEREAS doubts have arisen as to the meaning of the forty-fourth section of the "Volunteer Force Regulation Act of 1867" in respect of the time of commencement of service as an efficient Volunteer to entitle him to a free grant of fifty acres of land as therein mentioned and many Volunteers who have joined since the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight and received certificates for such grants have been unable in consequence of such doubts having arisen to obtain the issue of such grants and others similarly situated have for the same reason been refused their certificates Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. That the words in the forty-fourth section of the said Act "dating from the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight" shall be read and understood to mean "on and after the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight."



An Act to amend the "Veterinary Surgeons Regulation Act of 1907."

WHEREAS the Government of the State of South Australia has it as its policy to amend the "Veterinary Surgeons Regulation Act of 1907" in order to provide for the registration of veterinary surgeons and to provide for the regulation of the practice of the profession of veterinary surgery in the State of South Australia; and whereas it is expedient that the said Act should be amended accordingly; Her Majesty the Queen has been graciously pleased to give Her assent to the said Act as amended, and the said Act has accordingly become law.

Enacted by Her Majesty the Queen in Council, at Canberra, this 20th day of July, 1975.
