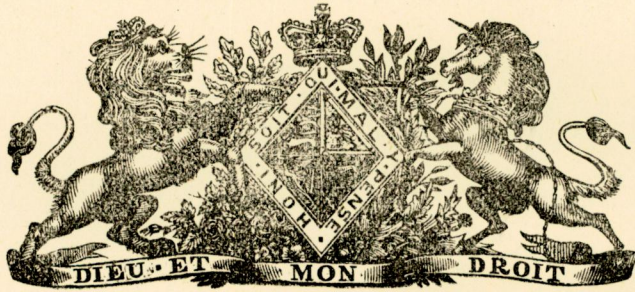

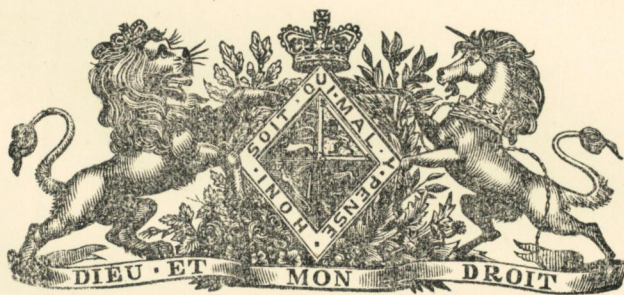

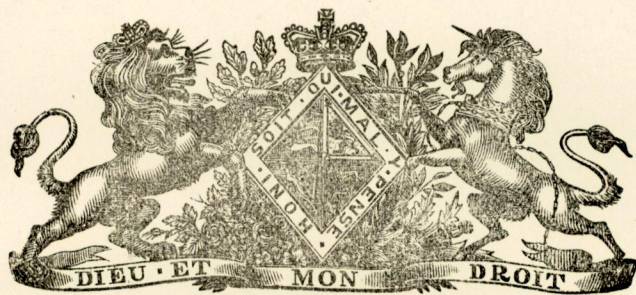

ARTICLE

The Act is enacted for the purpose of providing for the
protection of the public and the interests of the
State in the event of a rebellion or insurrection
in any part of the Dominion of Wales or the Town of
Cardiff.

BE it enacted that the following provisions shall have effect
in relation to the Dominion of Wales and the Town of
Cardiff, that is to say, that the Governor shall have power
to call out the Militia of the County of Glamorgan and
the Militia of the County of Glamorgan West, and to
employ them in such manner as he may think fit for the
purpose of suppressing any rebellion or insurrection
in any part of the Dominion of Wales or the Town of
Cardiff, and for the purpose of maintaining the peace
in any part of the Dominion of Wales or the Town of
Cardiff, and for the purpose of executing the laws
of the State in any part of the Dominion of Wales
or the Town of Cardiff.
