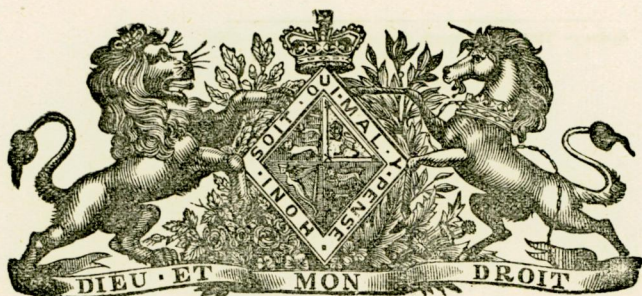

An Act to increase the Duties on Colonial Spirits.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

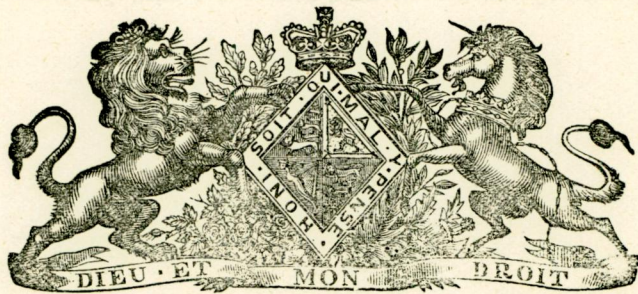

An Act to increase the Duties on Colonial Spirits. [Assented to, 6th February, 1880.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. In lieu of the duties now chargeable on Spirits manufactured in the Colony of New South Wales including all such Spirits now in bond there shall be taken and levied on all kinds of Spirits so manufactured the strength of which can be ascertained by Sykes' Hydrometer twelve shillings the proof gallon. Duties imposed.

2. Every person who shall on or before the passing of this Act have made or entered into any contract or agreement for the sale or delivery upon or at any time after the tenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine of any Colonial made Spirits whereupon any additional duty shall be payable under the provisions of this Act shall be at liberty to add to the price contracted for so much Duties on Spirits contracted for before Act to be delivered after it to be paid by purchaser.
