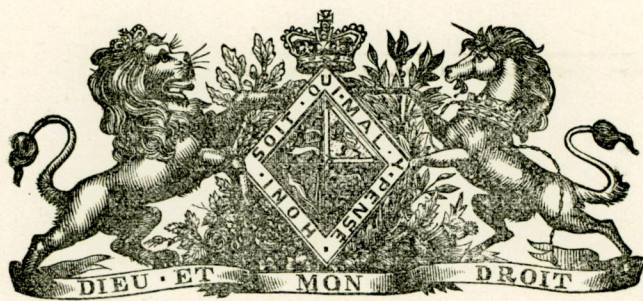

An Act to enable the present Collector of Customs (William Augustine Duncan Esquire) to retire upon a Superannuation Allowance.

WHEREAS William Augustine Duncan Esquire was appointed Preamble.

10 would otherwise have been entitled And whereas it is expedient to remove any such doubts and validate the right of the said William Augustine Duncan to retire upon a Superannuation Allowance as hereinafter provided Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative
15 Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. Upon the application of the said William Augustine Duncan Allowance to be granted on W. A. Duncan's retirement.
to retire from the Public Service under the provisions of this Act it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council

to grant to the said William Augustine Duncan such Superannuation Allowance as he would be legally entitled to but for such break in his continuous service.

2. All sums so made payable to the said William Augustine
 5 Duncan shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund under
 warrant or order of the Governor directed to the Colonial Treasurer
 who in his accounts shall be allowed credit for all sums of money paid
 in pursuance of such warrant or order And the receipts of the said
 William Augustine Duncan or person authorized as aforesaid shall be
 10 full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in respect of all pay-
 ments made under the authority of this Act.

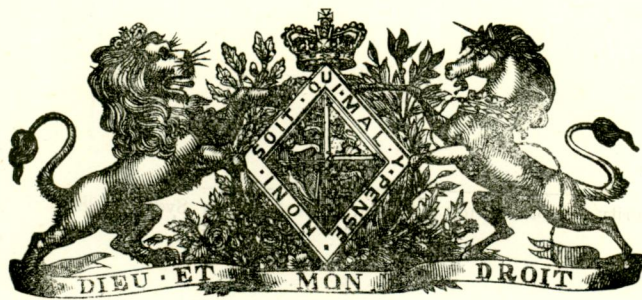
