A BILL

To amend the Constitution Act in respect of Taxation and Appropriation Bills.

[SIR ALFRED STEPHEN, C.B., K.C.M.G. ;—1 April, 1880.]

WHEREAS the Proviso in the first section of the Act commonly called The Constitution Act passed in this Colony by the then existing Legislature in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three and assented to by Her Majesty after certain amendments by virtue of an Act passed in the Imperial Parliament in the month of July one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five requires amendment Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. After the commencement of this Act no Bill passed by the Legislative Assembly for appropriating any part of the Public Revenue or for imposing any new rate tax or impost shall be amended in the Legislative Council but shall by that Chamber be passed or rejected only.
