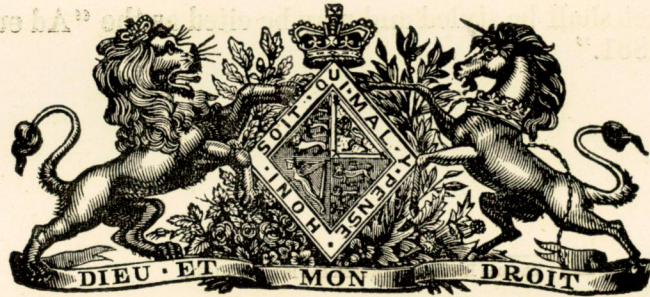

An Act to empower the Senate of the University of Sydney to confer Degrees in certain cases without Examination and to give to Bachelors of Arts the rights powers and privileges of Masters of Arts in certain cases.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council fourteenth Victoria number thirty-one intituled "An Act to incorporate and endow the University of Sydney" it is enacted that the Senate of the University shall have power after examination to confer the several degrees of Bachelor of Arts Master of Arts Bachelor of Laws Doctor of Laws Bachelor of Medicine and Doctor of Medicine And whereas it is expedient that the said Senate should be empowered to grant degrees without examination in the cases hereinafter specified And whereas it is expedient to admit Bachelors of Arts to have all the rights powers and privileges of Masters of Arts in certain cases Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

15. 1. Any degree which the Senate of the University of Sydney is now or may hereafter be empowered to confer after examination may at the discretion of the said Senate be conferred without examination

Degrees may be granted in certain cases to graduates of other Universities.

Ad eundem Degrees.

in the said University upon any person who shall have obtained a corresponding or equivalent degree in any other University recognized by the By-laws of the University of Sydney in force for the time being and the persons so admitted to such degrees shall be entitled to the same rights and privileges as appertain to those who have taken the same degrees in the ordinary course in the University of Sydney.

2. The provisions of this Act shall be carried into effect in accordance with such by-laws as may be made and approved in the manner prescribed by the said recited Act of Council.

10 3. From and after the passing of this Act every Bachelor of Arts of three years standing in the University of Sydney and of the full age of twenty-one years shall have all the rights powers and privileges of a Master of Arts in the Convocation of the University of Sydney.

15 4. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Ad eundem Degrees Act of 1881."

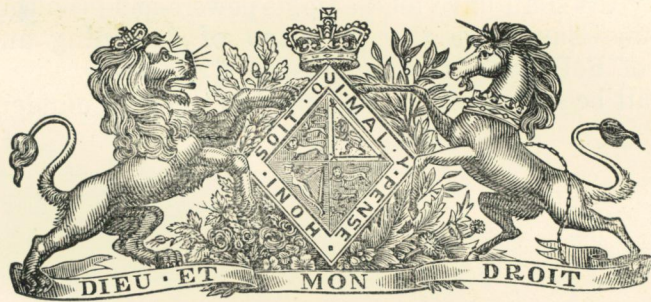

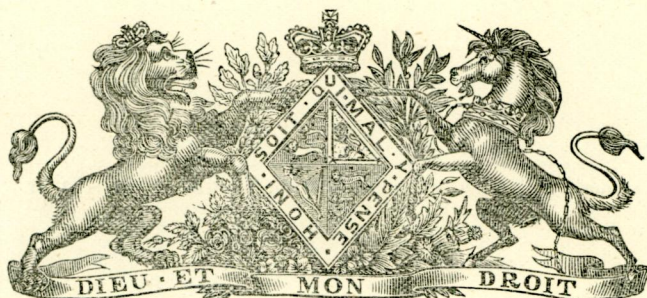
