Sunday Christmas Day and Good Friday or knowingly permit any person under the age of eighteen years to play on any such table or board such person shall be liable to a penalty for the first offence not exceeding ten pounds and not less than forty shillings and for every subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding thirty nor less than ten pounds.

10. The provisions of the "Licensing Act of 1882" relating to Procedure and the recovery of penalties appeals from convictions and orders the comprovisions of Licens petency of witnesses limitation of actions and informations compensation ing Act of 1882. for groundless charges the proof of being licensed and the appropriation of penalties and payment of fees and other moneys shall be applicable for all the purposes of this Act.

11. No unmarried woman (not being a widow) shall be capable Disqualification. of holding a billiard or bagatelle license under this Act.
