

An Act to protect and encourage the Acclimatization of certain Animals certain imported and other Birds.

THEREAS it is expedient to encourage the importation and Preamble. breeding of certain Birds and-other-Animals not indigenous to the Colony of New South Wales and also to prevent the destruction of certain Native Birds during the breeding season Be it therefore 5 enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same

as follows :-

The Act forty-second Victoria number ten is hereby repealed. Repeal of 42 Vic.
 This Act shall come into force immediately after the passing Commencement and thereof and may be cited as the "Animals Birds Protection Act of 1881." short title.
 The expression "Imported Animal Bird" in this Act means any Interpretation of animal bird mentioned in or which may be added to the First Schedule terms.

hereto "Native Bird"—Any bird mentioned in or which may be added to the First Schedule 15 to the Second Schedule hereto "Song Bird"—Any bird mentioned in or which may be added to the Third Schedule hereto "Scheduled Bird"— A bird of any of the kinds or families mentioned in or which shall be added to any Schedule to this Act <u>"Game</u>"—All animals mentioned in the First and Second Schedules of this Act And "Close Season"—The 20 period of time between every first day of August July and twenty-

eighth fifth day of February December then next succeeding both days inclusive. 397-

4. Any animal bird not mentioned in the Schedules hereto may by Colonial Secretary direction of the Colonial Secretary by a notice published in the Govern-may add any ment Gazette at any time hereafter be added to the appropriate Schedule to Schedules. to this Act and after the publication of such notice the provisions of 5 this Act shall apply to such animal bird and the production of the Gazette

containing such notice shall be conclusive evidence of such addition.

5. Any person who shall within a period of five years from the Penalty on killing &c. passing of this Act wilfully kill capture or injure or attempt or use any within five years. means whatever to kill capture or injure any imported animal or song 10 bird shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding

five pounds in addition to any penalty he may incur by reason of any infringement of the next succeeding section.

6. Any person who shall during the close season wilfully kill Penalty for killing &c. capture or injure or attempt or use any means whatever to kill capture during the close 15 or injure any scheduled bird shall for each such offence be liable to a season. penalty not exceeding five pounds.

7. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale or shall have in Penalty for having dead birds in his control or possession during the close season any scheduled bird possession. recently killed or taken shall for every such bird be liable to a penalty

20 not exceeding five pounds unless he shall prove that the bird was killed taken bought or received either during the period in which such bird could legally be killed or in or from another Colony.

8. No fire-arms having a greater length of barrel than six feet or Punt guns not to be with the bore exceeding one inch in diameter shall be used for the used &c

- 25 purpose of shooting any scheduled bird and no fire-arms of any description intended to be used for such purpose shall be affixed to any boat punt or floating vessel of any kind during any period of the year or be loaded with a charge exceeding four drachms of gunpowder or two ounces of shot and any person offending against the provisions of this 30 section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.
- 9. If any person shall take out of the nest or destroy in the nest Penalty on taking or the eggs of any scheduled bird mentioned in the First Schedule of this Act he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of ten shillings for each egg so taken or destroyed.
- 10. Nothing in the preceding section shall extend to any person Act not to extend to who shall have as owner in his possession any scheduled bird in con-35 finement or in a domesticated state provided such bird shall not have been found wild in this Colony or have been caught or taken within the period prohibited by this Act or to the owner of any eggs taken 40 from any mew or breeding place or to the possession of such eggs.

13. All informations or charges for offences against this Act Prosecution of may be heard and determined in a summary way before one Justice of offences. the Peace in accordance with the provisions of the Act or Acts for the time being in force with reference to summary proceedings before

14. All penalties recovered under this Act shall be paid—one-Disposal of penalties. half to the person who in the opinion of the convicting Justice of the 15 Peace shall have given such information as led to the conviction and

An Act to protect certain imported and other Birds. [Assented to, 20th December, 1881.]

HEREAS it is expedient to encourage the importation and Preamble. breeding of certain Birds not indigenous to the Colony of New South Wales and also to prevent the destruction of certain Native Birds during the breeding season Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. The Act forty-second Victoria number ten is hereby repealed. Repeal of 42 Vic. The Act forty-second Victoria number ten is not of the passing No. 10.
 This Act shall come into force immediately after the passing Commencement and short title. thereof and may be cited as the "Birds Protection Act of 1881."

3. The expression "Imported Bird" in this Act means any Interpretation of bird mentioned in or which may be added to the First Schedule terms. hereto "Native Bird"—Any bird mentioned in or which may be added to the Second Schedule hereto "Song Bird"—Any bird mentioned in or which may be added to the Third Schedule hereto "Scheduled Bird"— A bird of any of the kinds or families mentioned in or which shall be added to any Schedule to this Act And "Close Season"-The period of time between every first day of September and twenty-eighth day of February then next succeeding both days inclusive.

4.

Birds Protection.

4. Any bird not mentioned in the Schedules hereto may by direction of the Colonial Secretary by a notice published in the *Gazette* at any time hereafter be added to the appropriate Schedule to this Act and after the publication of such notice the provisions of this Act shall apply to such bird and the production of the *Gazette* containing such notice shall be conclusive evidence of such addition.

5. Any person who shall within a period of five years from the passing of this Act wilfully kill capture or injure or attempt or use any means whatever to kill capture or injure any imported or song bird shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds in addition to any penalty he may incur by reason of any infringement of the next succeeding section.

6. Any person who shall during the close season wilfully kill capture or injure or attempt or use any means whatever to kill capture or injure any scheduled bird shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

7. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale or shall have in his control or possession during the close season any scheduled bird recently killed or taken shall for every such bird be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds unless he shall prove that the bird was killed taken bought or received either during the period in which such bird could legally be killed or in or from another Colony.

8. No fire-arms having a greater length of barrel than six feet or with the bore exceeding one inch in diameter shall be used for the purpose of shooting any scheduled bird and no fire-arms of any description intended to be used for such purpose shall be affixed to any boat punt or floating vessel of any kind during any period of the year or be loaded with a charge exceeding four drachms of gunpowder or two ounces of shot and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

9. If any person shall take out of the nest or destroy in the nest the eggs of any scheduled bird he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of ten shillings for each egg so taken or destroyed.

10. Nothing in this Act shall apply to the taking or killing of any bird in a domesticated state or ordinarily in confinement by the owner thereof or to the taking or destroying of the eggs of any such bird by him or to any eggs taken from or any such bird taken or killed within any mew or breeding place by the owner thereof Provided that the bird so killed or taken shall not have been originally caught or taken during the close season.

11. Whenever any sheet of water island or enclosed land has been or shall be set apart by the Government or any private person for preserving any of the scheduled birds the Colonial Secretary may declare by notice in the *Gazette* such setting apart and the names of the birds intended to be preserved and thereafter any person other than the owner thereof who shall kill capture or injure any such bird within the limits of such water island or land shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds Provided that the Colonial Secretary may by a like notice cancel any such setting apart.

12. It shall be lawful for any householder or constable to require any person offending against any of the provisions of this Act to give his name in full and place of abode And in case such person shall after being so required refuse to give his real name or place of abode or shall give a false or fictitious name he may be at once arrested and taken before some Justice of the Peace and shall be liable for every such offence to an additional penalty not exceeding five pounds.

13. All informations or charges for offences against this Act may be heard and determined in a summary way before one Justice of the
