BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legis-

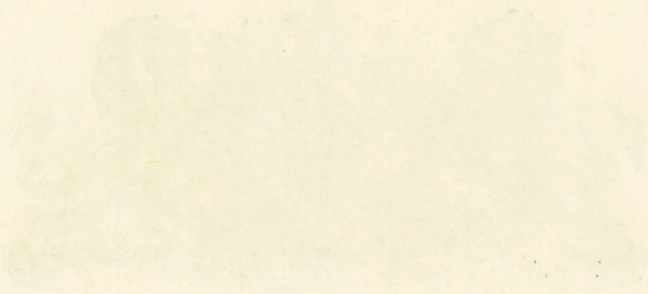

- 10 Crown Lands by reason only of user whether such user commenced before or after the passing of the "Crown Lands Alienation Act of 1861" Provided that nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of any party in any action commenced before the passing of this Act For the purposes of this Act the expression "Crown Lands" means all
- 15 lands vested in Her Majesty not granted or lawfully contracted to be granted in fee-simple and all lands vested in trustees or held in trust by any persons for public purposes within the meaning aforesaid.

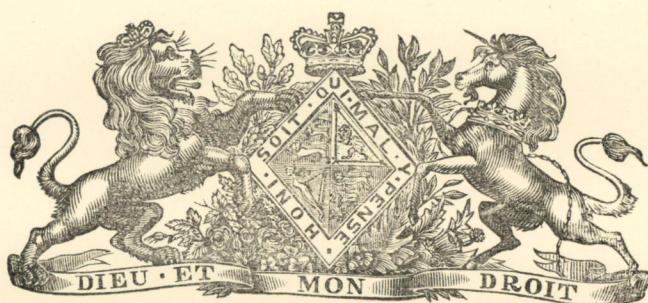

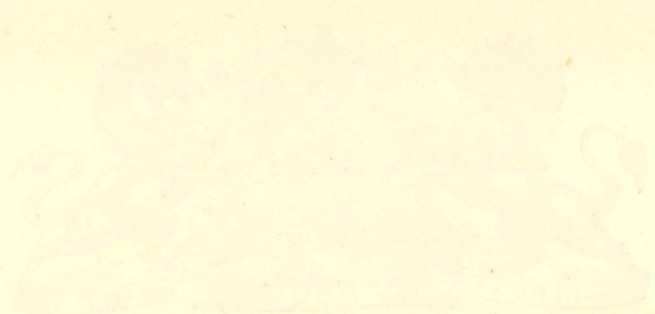

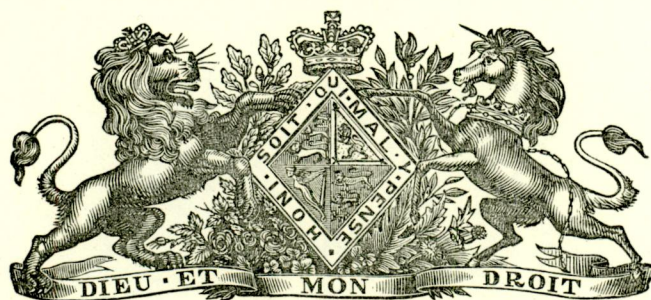

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. After the passing of this Act no dedication or grant of a right-of-way shall be presumed or allowed to be asserted or established as against the Crown or as against persons holding lands in trust for any public purpose and this whether in proceedings instituted by or on behalf of the Crown or not by reason only of user whether such user commenced before or after the passing of the "Crown Lands Alienation Act of 1861" Provided that nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of any party in any action commenced before the passing of this Act.
