An Act to prohibit the Importation of Grape-vines Grape-vinecuttings and Grapes.

THEREAS it is desirable to prevent the introduction of the Preamble. VV disease known as Phylloxera vastatrix Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New 5 South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:-
