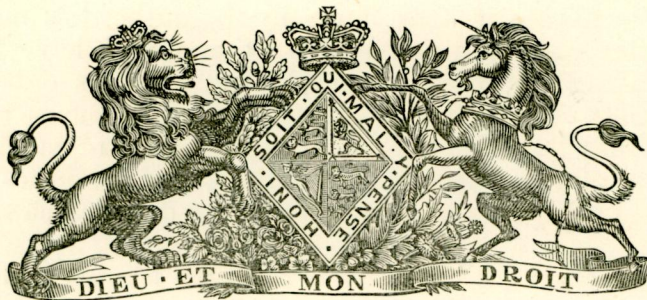

An Act to continue for a further term the "Liquor Licenses Suspensory Act 1880" and to amend the "Sale of Liquors Licensing Act of 1862."

WHEREAS it is expedient to continue the "Liquor Licenses Suspensory Act 1880" for a further term of Twelve calendar months from the expiration of the said Act and to amend the Law relating to removals of licenses to Public-houses within the County of Cumberland Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Act forty-fourth Victoria number seventeen (being the 10 "Liquor Licenses Suspensory Act 1880") shall from and after the day of the expiration of the said Act continue and be in force within the boundaries of the County of Cumberland for a further period of Twelve calendar months.

2. After the passing of this Act it shall not be lawful for any 15 Justices to grant a certificate under the twenty-seventh section of the "Sale of Liquors Licensing Act of 1862" (commonly known as a certificate

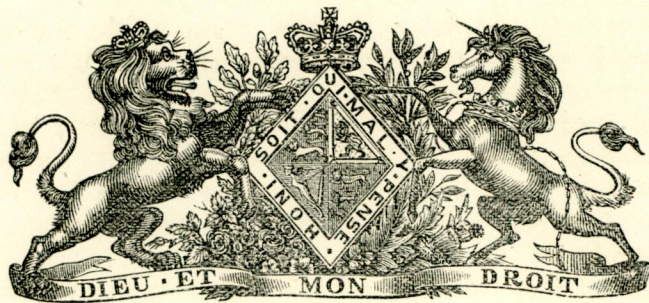

- (2.) The Court-house to the Justices assembled at which or the Petty Sessions to which an application for such certificate of removal is made is outside the boundaries of the said County and the house and premises for which the removal of the

- (3.) Any such certificate if acted upon by the authorities mentioned in the said twenty-seventh section would have the effect of making a license for a house and premises outside
 20 the boundaries of the City of Sydney apply to a house and premises within the boundaries of the said city or of making a license for a house and premises within the boundaries of the said city apply to a house and premises outside the said boundaries

25 The provisions of this section shall take effect upon the passing of this Act but shall not have operation beyond the time hereby limited for the continuation of the "Liquor Licenses Suspensory Act 1880."

3. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the "Liquor ^{Short title.} Licenses Suspensory Act Continuation Act 1881."

An Act to continue for a further term the "Liquor Licenses Suspensory Act 1880" and to amend the "Sale of Liquors Licensing Act of 1862." [Assented to, 6th April, 1881.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to continue the "Liquor Licenses Suspensory Act 1880" for a further term of Twelve calendar months from the expiration of the said Act and to amend the Law relating to removals of licenses to Public-houses within the County of Cumberland Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Act forty-fourth Victoria number seventeen (being the "Liquor Licenses Suspensory Act 1880") shall from and after the day of the expiration of the said Act continue and be in force within the boundaries of the County of Cumberland for a further period of Twelve calendar months.

- (2.) The Court-house to the Justices assembled at which or the Petty Sessions to which an application for such certificate of removal is made is outside the boundaries of the said County and the house and premises for which the removal of the license is sought are within such boundaries
- (3.) Any such certificate if acted upon by the authorities mentioned in the said twenty-seventh section would have the effect of making a license for a house and premises outside the boundaries of the City of Sydney apply to a house and premises within the boundaries of the said city or of making a license for a house and premises within the boundaries of the said city apply to a house and premises outside the said boundaries

The provisions of this section shall take effect upon the passing of this Act but shall not have operation beyond the time hereby limited for the continuation of the "Liquor Licenses Suspensory Act 1880."

Short title.

3. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the "Liquor Licenses Suspensory Act Continuation Act 1881."
