





An Act to make better provision for the protection of Life and Property from Fire and for other purposes. [Assented to, 24th January, 1884.7

THEREAS it is expedient to make better provision for the Preamble. W protection of life and property against loss or damage by fire in Sydney and its Suburbs (hereinafter termed the Metropolitan District) and within Municipalities to which this Act shall be extended Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :-

Constitution duties and powers of the Fire Brigades Board.

1. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Act a Fire Brigades Board. Board shall be constituted consisting of six members viz.-a Chairman to be appointed by the Governor who shall have the right to vote on all occasions and in the event of an equality of votes shall have a second or casting vote-one member to be elected by the Municipal Council of the City of Sydney—one to be elected by the Councils of the Municipalities enumerated in Schedule A hereto—two to be elected by the Insurance Companies namely one by the Fire Insurance Companies whose head-quarters are in New South Wales and one by the other Fire Insurance Companies carrying on business within the Colony

Colony and one by the Volunteer Companies as hereinafter provided The elected members shall hold office for two years and shall then retire but shall be eligible for re-election The Board shall under the name of the "Fire Brigades Board" be a body corporate and have a common seal and in its corporate name be capable of holding property of any description and of suing and being sued four members to form a quorum at all meetings of the Board If any of the electoral bodies herein mentioned shall on the prescribed day of election fail to elect the number of members which such body is by this Act empowered to elect the Governor shall within fourteen days after such default appoint and notify in the *Gazette* a member or members (as the case may be) instead of such electoral body so failing to elect And every person so appointed shall for all purposes of this Act be deemed to be a duly elected member of the Board.
