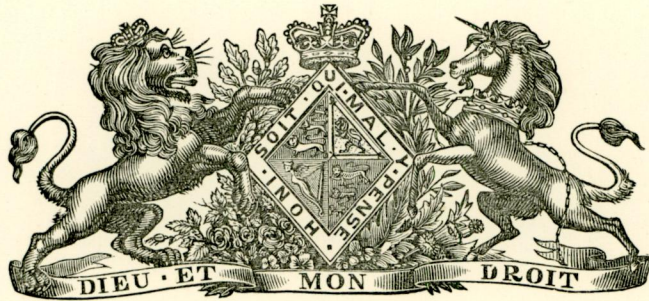

An Act to regulate the Salaries and Pensions of Judges of the Supreme Court.

WHEREAS it is expedient to increase the Salaries and Pensions Preamble.
of Judges of the Supreme Court Be it therefore enacted by

3. Judges' pensions as fixed by this Act shall be in every year Pensions secured.

4. This Act may be cited as the "Judges' Salaries and Pensions Short title.

An Act to regulate the Salaries and Pensions of Judges of the Supreme Court.

WHEREAS it is expedient to increase the Salaries and Pensions of Judges of the Supreme Court, it is therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to determine the amount and to appoint the several Judges of the said Supreme Court to receive the several salaries and the several pensions and the several allowances of every Judge of the said Supreme Court.
2. The amount to be paid to any Judge of the said Supreme Court shall be paid to him or her as aforesaid in the same manner as the amount of his or her salary or pension is payable to him or her as aforesaid.
3. The amount to be paid to any Judge of the said Supreme Court shall be paid to him or her as aforesaid in the same manner as the amount of his or her salary or pension is payable to him or her as aforesaid.
4. This Act may be cited as the "Judges' Salaries and Pensions Act of 1887."

Insert the following new Clauses :—

The term of office of each such Chief Justice and Judge shall cease at the expiration of twenty-one years from his appointment to the Bench but on waiver of pension he may be continued by the Governor for any additional term not exceeding seven years at the same rate of salary and with a right to additional pension at the above rate on final retirement.

Leave of absence whether on account of illness or otherwise shall not exceed one month in each year after which there shall be no payment of salary during absence from duty and any such Chief Justice or Judge so absenting himself more than one month in each year may be called upon by the Governor to retire altogether but he shall be entitled to a *pro rata* pension as above according to the time served.

On a resolution by either House that any Chief Justice or Judge paid according to this Act is incompetent for his duty the Governor may remove such Judge any previous Act to the contrary notwithstanding but he shall retain his right of pension *pro rata* as above.

Subject to individual arrangements with the Governor for reasonable leave of absence the recipients of pensions under this Act shall reside in the Colony and undertake without remuneration such light public duties as the Governor may assign them.

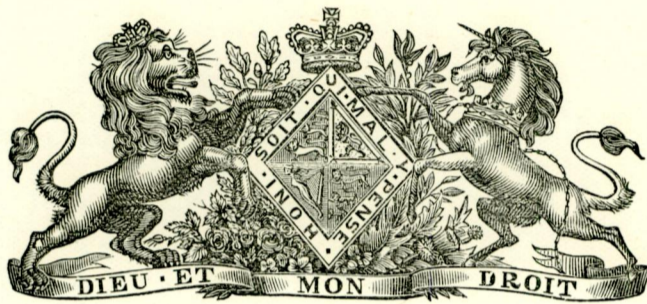
The term of office of each such Chief Justice and Judge shall cease at the expiration of twenty-one years from his appointment to the bench but on waiver of pension he may be continued by the Governor for any additional term not exceeding seven years at the same rate of salary and with a right to additional pension at the above rate on final retirement.

Leave of absence whether on account of illness or other cause shall not exceed one month in each year after which there shall be no payment of salary during absence from duty and any such Chief Justice or Judge so absenting himself more than one month in each year may be called upon by the Governor to return and accept of the same and be entitled to a pro rata pension as above according to the time served.

On a resolution by either House that any Chief Justice or Judge held according to this Act is incompetent for his duties the Governor may remove such Judge and pension Act to the contrary notwithstanding but he shall retain the right of pension as if he had served.

Subject to individual arrangements with the Governor for respective years of absence the recipients of pensions under this Act shall reside in the Colony and undertake without remuneration such light public duties as the Governor may require them.

Supreme Court or on permanent disability or infirmity shall be seven-
tenths of his actual salary at the time of such retirement.

3. Judges' pensions as fixed by this Act shall be in every year Pensions secured.
charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

4. This Act may be cited as the "Judges' Salaries and Pensions Short title.
Act of 1883."
