Subject to individual arrangements with the Governor for reasonable leave of absence the recipients of pensions under this Act shall reside in the Colony and undertake without remuneration such light public duties as the Governor may assign them.

WHEREAS it is expedient to increase the Salaries and Pensions Preamble. of Judges of the Supreme Court Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:-

1. From and after the first day of January one thousand eight Judges' salaries. hundred and eighty-three the annual salary of the Chief Justice shall be Three thousand five hundred pounds and the annual salary of every

Puisne Judge Two thousand six hundred pounds.

2. The pension to be paid to any Chief Justice or Puisne Judge Judges' pensions. retiring after fifteen years service in the Colony as a Judge of the Supreme Court or on permanent disability or infirmity shall be seventenths of his actual salary at the time of such retirement.

3. Judges' pensions as fixed by this Act shall be in every year Pensions secured.
