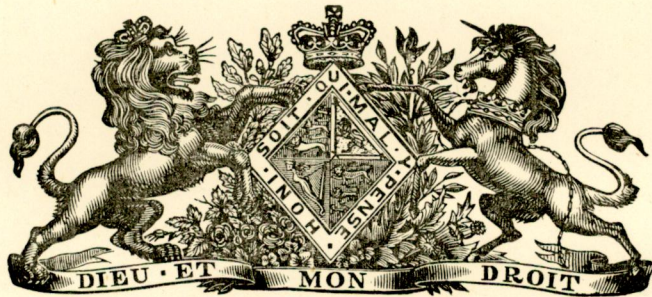

An Act to extend the jurisdiction of Courts of Petty Sessions.

WHEREAS it is desirable to extend the jurisdiction of Courts of Petty Sessions in New South Wales Preamble. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. All Courts of Petty Sessions now established or that may hereafter be established in the Colony of New South Wales shall have power and authority to hear and determine in a summary way and according to equity and good conscience all actions whatsoever for the recovery of any debt to an amount in any case not exceeding thirty pounds and whether the party sued shall or shall not consent to such jurisdiction. Jurisdiction extended to £30.

2. Provided always and it is hereby enacted that nothing in this Act contained shall be construed to give jurisdiction to Courts of Petty Sessions in any case in which jurisdiction is denied by either of the provisos in the fourth section of the "Small Debts Act" tenth Victoria number ten. Not to interfere with provisos to sec. 4 of 10 Vic. No. 10.
