WHEREAS it is expedient to authorize the Governor with the Preamble. advice of the Executive Council to raise by way of Loan for the Public Service of the Colony certain sums of money amounting in the whole to Two million pounds for the several purposes hereinafter specified and also to amend the "Public Works Loan Act of 1876" in respect to the appropriation thereunder for the railways Orange to Wellington and Wellington to Dubbo Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—
