To enable the University of Sydney to grant additional Degrees and Certificates in the nature of Degrees and for other purposes.

**W**HEREAS by the Act fourteenth Victoria number thirty-one Preamble.  
power was given to the Senate of the University of Sydney to confer the several degrees of Bachelor of Arts Master of Arts Bachelor of Laws Doctor of Laws Bachelor of Medicine and Doctor of Medicine  
5 but no power was given to confer other degrees or certificates in the nature of degrees And whereas it is expedient that the Senate should have extended powers to confer degrees and certificates in the nature of degrees And whereas the Senate has agreed to admit women to certain privileges heretofore enjoyed by men within the University but  
10 doubts have arisen as to the power of the Senate in that respect under the said recited Act Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

15 1. The Senate is hereby empowered to give instruction and grant such degrees and certificates in the nature of degrees as it shall think fit in all branches of knowledge except Theology or Divinity Senate empowered to grant additional degrees and certificates.  
Provided that no student in the University shall be compelled to attend lectures upon or to pass examinations in any of the following subjects  
20 namely—Ethics Metaphysics and Modern History.

2. All persons upon whom the degree of Master or Doctor shall be conferred in pursuance of the provisions of this Act shall have the same rights and privileges within the University hitherto enjoyed by Status &c. of graduates under this Act.  
graduates holding the degree of Master of Arts Doctor of Laws or  
25 Doctor of Medicine and all persons upon whom in pursuance of the said provisions the degree of Bachelor or any other certificate or qualification which the Senate may by by-law declare to be of equivalent rank to the degree of Bachelor of Arts shall have the same rights and privileges hitherto enjoyed by Bachelors of Arts within the said  
30 University.

3. The benefits and advantages of the University and the provisions of the Acts relating thereto shall be deemed to extend in all Women to be admitted to University privileges &c.  
respects to women equally with men.

4. This Act may be cited as the "University Extension Act of Short title.

WHEREAS by the Act fourthly Victoria number thirty-one 1883 power was given to the Senate of the University of Sydney to confer the several degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Laws, Doctor of Laws, Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Divinity and no power was given to confer other degrees or certificates in the name of degrees: And whereas it is expedient that the Senate should have extended powers to confer degrees and certificates in the name of degrees: And whereas the Senate has agreed to confer certain privileges heretofore enjoyed by men within the University and to confer as to the power of the Senate in that respect under the said Act: He it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the said Senate: That

1. The Senate is hereby empowered to give instruction and to confer such degrees and certificates in the name of degrees as it shall think fit in all branches of knowledge except Theology or Divinity: Provided that no student in the University shall be a candidate for a degree or to pass examinations in any of the following subjects:—Ethics, Mathematics and Modern History.

2. All persons upon whom the Senate shall confer shall be entitled to possession of the provisions of the Act: And shall have the same rights and privileges as in the University Act are enjoyed by students holding the degree of Bachelor of Arts, Doctor of Laws or Doctor of Medicine and all persons upon whom in pursuance of the said Act the Senate and the Senate or any other condition or condition which the Senate may by law declare to be a condition: And to the degree of Bachelor of Arts shall have the same rights and privileges as in the University Act are enjoyed by students holding the said degree.

3. The Senate and advantages of the University and the provisions of the Act relating thereto shall be deemed to extend in all respects to women equally with men.

4. This Act may be cited as the "University Extension Act of 1883."
