An Act to prohibit Net-fishing in the Waters of Port Jackson.  
[Assented to, 18th August, 1886.]

WHEREAS it is expedient that Net-fishing of every kind should be prohibited in the waters of Port Jackson, and it is therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of South Australia in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Fisheries Act of 1881 or any other Act or any licence granted or to be granted under any such Act, no person shall cast or set out or use any net or seine in any place westward of a straight line drawn from the north to the south end of the point in the county of Cumberland known as Port Jackson for the purpose of catching or taking or causing to be caught or taken any fish or other aquatic animal, or any person who does so shall be liable to the forfeiture of the net or seine used, and any such net or seine to the possession of the net or seine, a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for the first offence and for the second on any subsequent offence not less than five pounds nor more than twenty pounds respectively, a summary trial before any Justice of the Peace, and every such net and all lines, leads, coils and gear connected therewith shall be forfeited to the Justice upon conviction of the offence.

2. No net or seine shall be cast or set out or used or used in any place within the tidal waters of Port Jackson with a lead line or a coil and line.

3. The Act may be cited as the "Prohibition in Port Jackson Fisheries Act of 1886."

Notwithstanding anything in the "Fisheries Act of 1881" or any other Act or any license granted or proclamation issued under any such Act no person shall cast or set any net of any kind whatsoever in any place westward of a straight line drawn from the north to the south head of the inlet in the county of Cumberland known as Port Hacking for the purpose of catching or adapted to catch or capable of catching fish and whether within the waters of the said inlet subject to or beyond the influence of the tide Any person who casts or sets any such net contrary to the provisions of this Act shall incur a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for the first offence and for the second or any subsequent offence not less than five pounds nor more than twenty pounds recoverable in a summary way before any two Justices of the Peace And every such net and all lines leads corks and gear connected therewith shall be forfeited to Her Majesty upon conviction of the offender.

Port Hacking closed against net-fishing.

2. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prevent any person from fishing within the tidal waters of Port Hacking with a hand line or a rod and line.

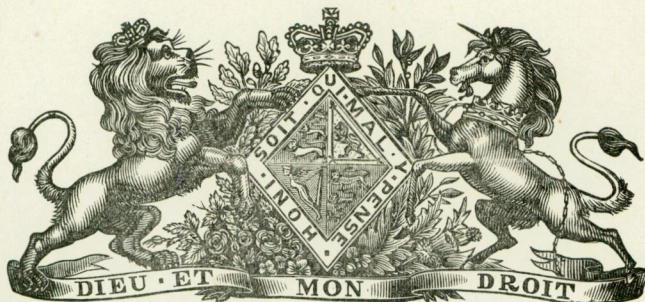

An Act to prohibit Net-fishing in the Waters of Port Hacking.  
[Assented to, 13th August, 1886.]

**W**HEREAS it is expedient that Net-fishing of every kind should be prohibited in the waters of Port Hacking Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

Preamble.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the "Fisheries Act of 1881" or any other Act or any license granted or proclamation issued under any such Act no person shall cast or set any net of any kind whatsoever in any place westward of a straight line drawn from the north to the south head of the inlet in the county of Cumberland known as Port Hacking for the purpose of catching or adapted to catch or capable of catching fish and whether within the waters of the said inlet subject to or beyond the influence of the tide Any person who casts or sets any such net contrary to the provisions of this Act shall incur a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for the first offence and for the second or any subsequent offence not less than five pounds nor more than twenty pounds recoverable in a summary way before any two Justices of the Peace And every such net and all lines leads corks and gear connected therewith shall be forfeited to Her Majesty upon conviction of the offender.

Port Hacking closed against net-fishing.
