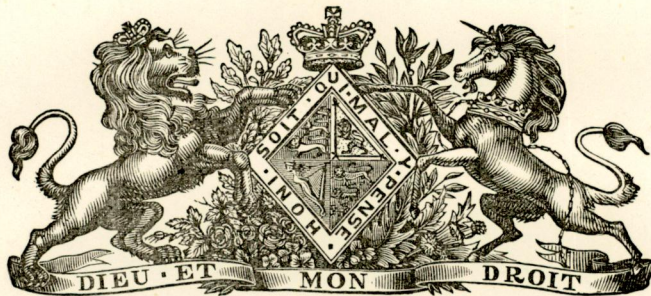

An Act to give effect to a Resolution of the Legislative Assembly that a sum of money not exceeding £10,000 should be granted out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to Sir John Robertson.

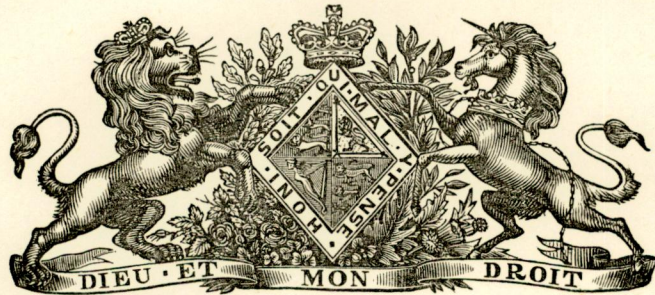
**W**HEREAS the Legislative Assembly did on the sixth day of July Preamble.  
in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six pass the following Resolution viz. :—“That in view of the long distinguished and patriotic services of Sir John Robertson K.C.M.G. a late Member of this House there be granted to him out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales a sum not exceeding Ten Thousand Pounds sterling” And whereas it is expedient that such Resolution should be carried into effect by Legislative enactment Be it therefore enacted by the Queen’s Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor by warrant under his hand addressed to the Colonial Treasurer to direct the payment out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to Sir John Robertson Knight Commander of Saint Michael and Saint George late a Member for the Electoral District of Mudgee in this present Parliament of the sum of Ten Thousand Pounds sterling And such warrant shall charge the Consolidated Revenue Fund with the payment of the said sum and shall be a discharge for such payment to the said Treasurer.

To let to any person or persons, a Resolution of the Legislative Assembly that a sum of money not exceeding £10,000 should be granted out of the consolidated Revenue Fund to Mr. John Roberts, as detailed for 30th July 1880.

*WHEREAS* the Legislative Assembly did on the sixteenth day of July 1880, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six pass the following Resolution, to wit:—That in view of the long distinguished and patriotic services of Mr. John Roberts, K.C.M.G. a late Member of this House, it be resolved to grant to him out of the consolidated Revenue Fund of the South Wales a sum not exceeding Ten Thousand Pounds sterling. And whereas it is expedient that such Resolution should be carried into effect by legislative enactment, be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor or Governors under his hand and seal to issue a warrant to the said Mr. John Roberts, or to any person or persons, to draw the payment out of the consolidated Revenue Fund to Mr. John Roberts, K.C.M.G. a late Member of this House, and such warrant shall be a receipt for the sum of Ten Thousand Pounds sterling. And such warrant shall charge the consolidated Revenue Fund to the extent of the said sum and shall be a charge on such payment to the said Treasury.
