An Act to declare valid an amended alignment of Essex-street in the City of Sydney.

WHEREAS the existing alignment of Essex-street, in the City of Preamble. Sydney, is defective and inconvenient in respect to the footways, and it is expedient to declare valid the proposed alignment of such foot-ways to the width hereinafter specified and to make such 5 other provision in respect to such street as is hereinafter contained. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. After the passing of this Act the foot-ways and carriage-way Dedication as to 10 in Essex-street, from George to Princes Street, shall be of the respective carriage and foot ways of Essex-street. dimensions shown on a plan of the said street, shall be of the respective dimensions shown on a plan of the said street, numbered 1A, now deposited in the Town Hall, at Sydney. And notwithstanding any-thing in any Act of Parliament the carriage-way and foot-ways so 15 shown, shall for all purposes of the eighty-eighth and eighty-ninth sections of the "Sydney Corporation Act of 1879," be deemed to have

been duly aligned and set out under the authority of the said lastmentioned Act, and to be binding and conclusive on all persons.
